<u>Res. #2019-276:</u> Moved by Councillor Bain, seconded by Councillor Mendicino Whereas the Ontario Northland Transportation Commission (the "ONTC") has provided vital rail and highway connections across the North with rail service having a predominant presence in the Northeast for over 100 years;

> And Whereas the ONTC's rail service is crucial to recharging the North's forestry sector by maintaining and growing it's mining sector;

And Whereas the City of North Bay has previously advocated for Ontario Northland and promoted ONTC's transportation services including Rail Freight, Motor Coach, Bus Parcel Express and Remanufacturing and Repair as a strong and sustainable business which is beneficial for Northern Ontario;

And Whereas the ONTC is within the Ministry of Energy Northern Development and Mines (ENDM);

And Whereas President of the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities, Danny Whalen, commented to the Premier, "we question if this is the best opportunity to grow the ONTC and if the needs of the residents of the North are best met with this current arrangement";

And Whereas the Ministry of Transportation (MTO) has a history of experience in northern transportation needs, as well as staff and equipment to engineer and construct transportation links. This engineering expertise and equipment resources could be of benefit to both the MTO and the ONTC to eliminate the duplication of resources. A sharing of tendering processes could also potentially reap further financial benefits;

And Whereas the list of benefits from this realignment for both the ONTC and Northern Ontario is lengthy and worth investigating. By moving this vital part of the Ontario economy to the MTO we would be in a better position to get our resources to global markets. We will also be better positioned to grow our Northern economies; provide improved services for Northern residents and strengthen the Northern labour force.

Therefore Be It Resolved that the City of North Bay ask Premier Doug Ford and Cabinet to investigate transferring the Ontario Northland Transportation Commission to the Ministry of Transportation.

And Further Be It Resolved that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to Premier Doug Ford, Christine Elliot, Deputy Premier and Minister of Health and Long-Term Care; Greg Rickford, Minister, Ministry of Energy, Northern Development and Mines; Jeff Yurek, Minister, Ministry of Transportation, Vic Fedeli, Minister of Finance; Tom Laughren, Chair of the Ontario Northland Transportation Commission; the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities and the Leaders of Provincial Opposition.
