<u>Res. #2005-585:</u> Moved by Councillor Chirico, seconded by Councillor Anthony WHEREAS the Province of Ontario has confirmed to the City of North Bay that the Ontario Municipal Partnership Fund funding model will impact the taxpayers of this City by reducing funding in 2006 and continuing until 2009 when it is forecasted that funding will be reduced by \$3,132,000.00 from 2004 reconciled base funding;

AND WHEREAS this could have an impact on the taxpayers of the City of North Bay of approximately 7.0% in their annual property taxes;

AND WHEREAS the funding required is to offset provincially downloaded services;

ND WHEREAS the impact on local taxpayers could almost double if the

cost of the downloaded services increase by an inflation allowance of 3% per year;

AND WHEREAS it appears that the use of weighted assessment values as a determining factor in OMPF calculations does not reflect the communities ability to pay and is flawed;
