BY-LAW NO. 1510 Combay Sylver 1514

A BY-LAW to Levy the Taxes for the year 1948 and to provide for the collection thereof.

WHEREAS it is necessary and expedient to levy on the whole rateable property, according to the last revised Assessment Roll of the City of North Bay, a sum of money for the General Purposes of the City for Public, Separate, Collegiate and Vocational School Education. Public Library, Direct Relief and other purposes.

THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. For the purpose of providing the sum of \$591,767.00 for the general purpose of the Corporation, including the amount required for Public, Separate, Collegiate and Vocational Schools, Public Library, Direct Relief and other purposes for the Current Year, there shall be levied and collected a rate of 53.00 Mills in the Dollar upon the Whole rateable property of the Public School Supporters of the City of North Bay according to the last revised Assessment Roll which rate is made up as follows:

Public Library Board	1.04
Collegiate & Vocational School Rate	7.75
Public School Rate	14.00
Direct Relief	1.49
Home of the Aged	0.70

And there shall be levied and collected during the said year a rate of 59.00 Millss in the Dollar upon the Whole rateable property of the City of North Bay, of the Separate School Supporters according to the last revised Assessment Roll, which rate is made up as follows:

General Rate ----- 22.16 Being 23.16 Mills less One Mill deduction as provided by the Ontario Government Subsidy.

Separate School Rate	20.00
Direct Relief	1.49
Home of the Aged	0.70

- 2. And it is hereby enacted that all taxes shall be paid in the Office of the Treasurer or the Collector of the City of North Bay.
- 3. The property Taxes shall be payable in three instalments, one instalment of Forty (40%) per-cent shall be payable on the 15th day of May, 1948, 30% on the 15th day of July, 1948, and 30% on the 15th day of September, 1948.
- 4. All Business Taxes shall be payable in one instalment on the 15th day of May, 1948.
- 5. A penalty for non payment of Taxes or any Instalment thereof including both Business and Property Taxes of one half per centum shall be added on the first day of default, and every thirty days thereafter in which default continues but not after the end of the year in which the taxes are levied namely:-
- (a) Taxes payable on the 15th day of May, 1948, if paid after May 19th, 1948 one half per centum shall be added on May 20th, 1948, and one half per centum every thirty days in which default continues during 1948.
- (b) Taxes payable on the 15th day of July, 1948 if paid after July 19, 1948, one half per centum shall be added on July 20, 1948 and one half per centum every thirty days in which default continues during 1948.
- (c) Taxes payable on the 15th day of September, 1948 if paid after September 18th, 1948 one half per centum shall be added on September 20, 1948 and one half per centum every thirty days in which default continues during 1948.

## Continued:

- 6. In default of payment of any instalment of Taxes or any part of any instalment by the day named herein for the payment thereof, the subsequent instalment or instalments shall forthwith become payable.
- 7. The Collector's Rolls for the year 1948, shall be returned by the Tax Collector to the City Treasurer under the provisions of the statutes in that behalf.
- 8. Nothing herein done shall prevent the Tax Collector from proceeding at any time with the Collection of any rate, Tax or Assessment, or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of the statutes and By-Lagoverning the collection of taxes.
- 9. The Collector of Taxes may mail or cause to be mailed to the address of the Residence or place of Business of each person taxes, the Notice specifying the amount of Taxes and Local Improvements, rates payable by such person.
