
The City of North Bay wishes to advise the public of an amendment to By-Law 35-96 (Being a By-Law to regulate the use of public parks within the City of North Bay)

By-Law 2010-165 amends this By-Law by inserting the following under Part V.

BICYCLE HELMETS

- 28.1 (a) No person under 18 years of age shall ride on or operate a bicycle while on the Kate Pace Way or the Kinsmen Trail unless the person is wearing a bicycle helmet that complies with the regulation under the Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. H.8 and the chin strap of the helmet is securely fastened under the chin.
 - (b) No parent or guardian of a person under sixteen years of age shall authorize or knowingly permit that person to ride on or operate a bicycle on the Kate Pace Way or the Kinsmen Trail unless the person is wearing a bicycle helmet that complies with the regulations under the Highway Traffic Act. R.S.O. 1990, C. H.8 and the chin strap of the helmet is securely fastened under the chin.



Safe Use of Hazardous Products


If you must use hazardous products, keep the following tips in mind in order to minimize your exposure to chemicals and potential danger to the environment:

- Buy only what you need.
- Give away what you do not use.
- Share seldom used products.
- Buy alternative products that are less hazardous.
- Never mix products together.
- Use only recommended amounts (more is not better).
- Choose products with child-resistant caps.
- Safely store all hazardous materials out of reach of children and pets.
- Use products in a well-ventilated area.
- Never pour HHW in the storm sewer it leads to Lake Nipissing.
- Do not bury hazardous waste or pour it into the ground it can contaminate groundwater.

Preparing HHW for Safe & Easy Transport

All materials should be left in the original container to allow easy identification of the contents.

- Never mix products together
- Waste should be sealed & labeled
- Bring all hazardous waste in a cardboard box or rigid container
- Collect household batteries in a small plastic container or coffee can
