BEING A BY-LAW of the City of North Bay to establish, maintain and operate a fluoridation system in connection with the City water system.

WHEREAS by authority of Sect. 2 (1) of the Fluoridation Act being Chap. 30, S.O. 1960-61 a municipality may, by by-law, establish, maintain and operate a fluoridation system in connection with the water works system, and WHEREAS it is deemed advisable to establish, maintain and operate a fluoridation system in connection with the waterworks system of the City of North Bay NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:-

- 1. THAT a fluoridation system be established, maintained and operated in connection with the waterworks system of the City of North Bay.
- 2. THAT said fluoridation system shall be established, maintained and operated in accordance with The Fluoridation Act, Chap. 30, S.O. 1960-61 and any regulations made thereunder.
- 3. THAT this by-law shall take effect on the date of final passing.


