Demographics

North Bay has a population of 51,553. The regional trading area representing people within the districts of Nipissing and Parry Sound, Timmins, Temiskaming Shores and Cobalt contains a population of approximately 112,000.

The North Bay Census Agglomeration includes the City of North Bay, East Ferris Township, Bonfield Township, Municipality of Callander, Chisholm Township, Nipissing Township, Nipissing Unorganized (North Part) and Municipality of Powassan. The total population for North Bay Census Agglomeration 2016 Census of Population was approximately 70,378.

North Bay Waterfront

The City of North Bay is well known for its magnificent waterfront, an area that has become the flagship attraction of the community. Adjacent to the downtown core, pedestrians are connected to the waterfront through an underpass walkway.

With sandy beaches, walking paths surrounded by beautiful gardens, warm and shallow waters, ample fishing and boating opportunities, snowmobiling, picture perfect sunsets, and an endless variety of seasonal activities, the waterfront is the place to be.

North Bay's waterfront is located on the shores of Lake Nipissing, adjacent to King's Landing, home port for the Chief Commanda II tour watercraft, and includes:

- Abundant walkways and free parking
- An arboretum of plants, trees, and ornamental grass
- Municipal marina featuring 250 boat slips adjacent to the picnic & band shelters
- Beaches for swimming
- Heritage Mini-Train and Heritage Carousels
- Fully accessible playground
- Volleyball courts
- The Kate Pace Way – a paved multi-use non-motorized route that runs along the shoreline

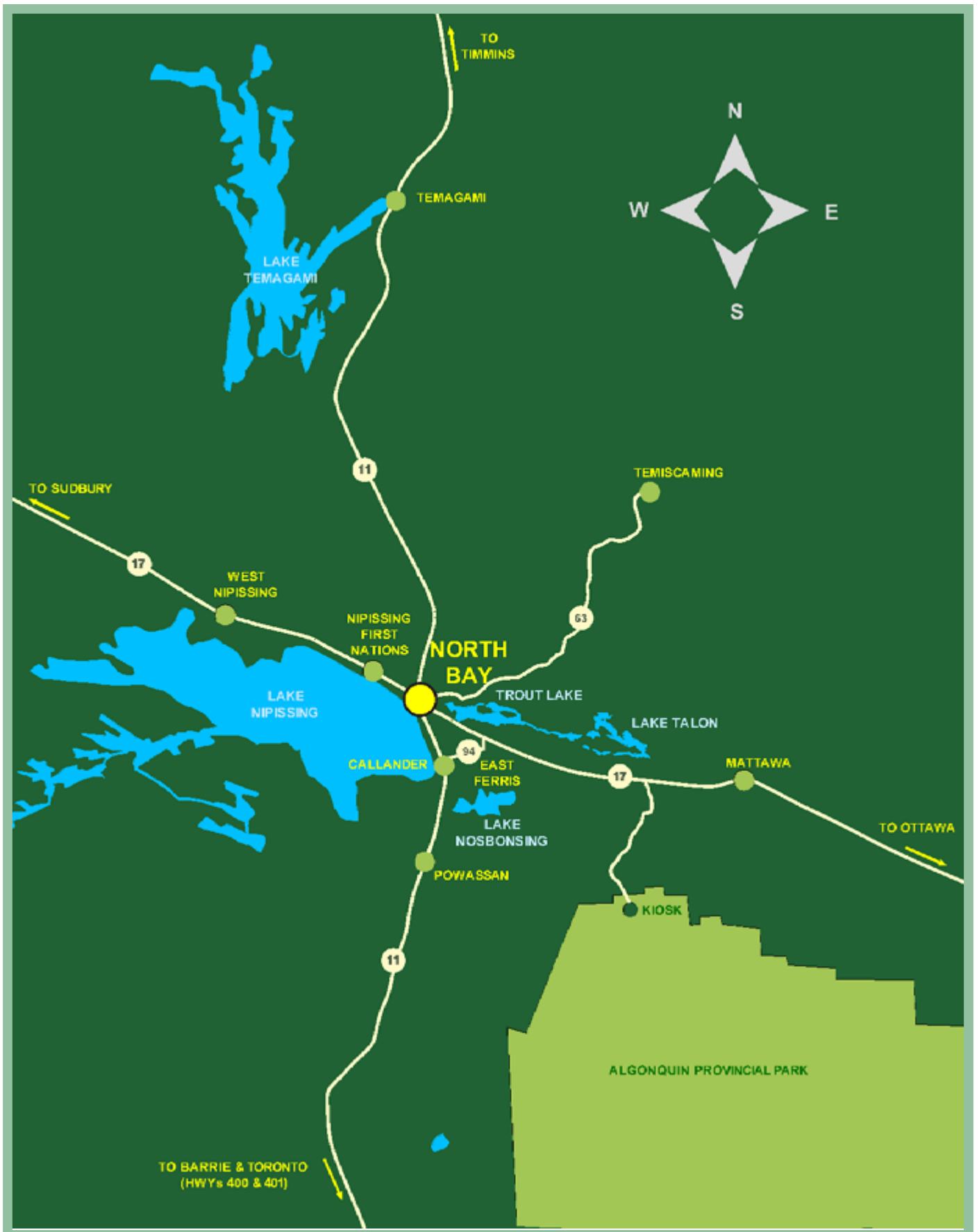
Temagami

Parks & Arenas

North Bay has 73 park areas including playgrounds and picnic shelters that provide places for people to relax, picnic, play, walk, or swim.

There are a number of sports fields throughout the City of North Bay that are available for community and sport organization use from June to September each year. This includes the Steve Omischl Sports Field Complex, located in the south end of the City.

During the winter, North Bay has several outdoor rinks located throughout the city. Three indoor arenas are available for use all year round.
