BY-LAW NO. 1776

BEING A BY-LAW to provide for the submission of a certain By-Law for

the assent of the qualified electors of the City of North Bay and to appoint a day on which to take a vote thereon and to name the places where votes are to be taken and to appoint Deputy Returning Officers to take the vote at each such place.

WHEREAS the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay deems it advisable to submit to the vote of the electors of the Corporation, Schedule A, By-Law No. affixed hereto and forming part of this By-Law, being a By-Law to provide that the term of office of the Mayor and Members of Council of the Municipality shall be two years.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- That there shall be submitted to the electors of the City of North Bay, Schedule A, By-Law No. affixed hereto and forming part of this By-Law, being a By-Law to provide that the term of office of the Mayor and Members of Council of the Municipality shall be two years.
- 2. That the vote of the said electors shall be taken on the said By-Law at the same time and places and by the Deputy Returning Officers and Poll Clerks, as the Annual Municipal Elections.
- 3. That a true copy of the By-Law shall be published in the North Bay Daily Nugget on the days hereinafter mentioned, that is to say on the Seventh, Fourteenth and Twenty-first days of November 1955.
- 4. On the 29th day of November at his office in the Council Chambers, on McIntyre Street, in the City of North Bay at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, the Mayor will in writing, signed by him, appoint two persons to attend the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk of the Corporation, and one person to attend each Polling Place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of promoting the acceptance of the said By-Law, and a like number on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of the rejection of the said By-Law.
- 5. The Fourteenth day of December at the said Council Chambers at 12 o'clock in the forenoon is hereby appointed as the time and place for summing up by the Clerk of this Corporation of the number of votes given in the affirmative and in the negative, respectively.

WHEREAS representations have been made, that in order to facilitate the proper handling of the business of the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay, the Mayor and Members of the Council should be elected for a term of two years. NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY UNDER AUTHORITY OF THE MUNICIPAL ACT, R.S.O. 1950, Chapter 243, and more particularly Section 77, Sub-section,1, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- That the Term of the Mayor and Councillors hereafter shall be for a Full Term of Two Years.
- 2. This By-Law shall not come into force and effect until it shall have received the assent of the Electors qualified to vote thereon.
