A BY-LAN of the Corporation of the City of $N_{0} r t h$ Bay to authorize exhibitions of moving pictures, theatrical performances, concerts and lectures in the City of North Bay, on the Lord's Day.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 (1) of the Lord's Day (Ontario) Act, being O.S. 1960-61, Chapter 50, that by-laws may be passed to make it lawful to provide, engage in or be present at exhibitions of moving pictures, theatrical performances, concerts and lectures:

AND WHEREAS pursuant to subsection 4 of Section 2 of the Lord's Day (Ontario) Act, Chapter 50, O.S. 1960-61, a vote was taken at the last municipal election held at the City of North Bay on the loth day of December, 1962, at which a majority of the electors who voted on the question voted in the affirmative;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to pass this by-law under the authority of the said section;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THF CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. THAT it is lawful in the City of North Bay for any person after 1:30 $0^{\prime}$ clock in the afternoon and before 12:00 $0^{\prime}$ clock in the afternoon of the Lord's Day to provide, engage in or be present at any exhibition of moving pictures, any theatrical performances, any concert or any lecture which, but for the said Act, would be unlawful under Section 6 of the Lord's Day Act (Canada); and it is lawful in the City as aforesaid to do or engage any other person to do any work, business or labour in connection with any such exhibition of moving pictures, theatrical performances, concerts or lectures.
2. THAT this by-law shall come into force and have effect immediately after the final passing thereof.
