

BY-LAW NO. 1220

BEING A BY-LAW of the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay to close certain lanes and streets within the said City of North Bay.

WHEREAS the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the City of North Bay have been requested, and upon consideration, deem it advisable to close Kehoe Street running from Rose Avenue to the City Limits and to close Lorne Avenue between McLeod Street and O'Brien Street and to close Rose Avenue between McLeod Street and O'Brien Street and to close all lanes in a block bounded on the south by High Street, on the north by the City Limits, and on the west by McLeod Street and on the east by O'Brien Street and to convey the said streets and lanes upon their being closed to North Bay College, a private corporation whose head office is in the City of North Bay.

THEREFORE under and by virtue of the authority vested in the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay by the Municipal Act, being R.S.O. 1927, Chapter 233, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay enacts as follows:-

1. (a) That portion of Kehoe Street between the southerly limit of Rose Avenue and the City Limits be and the same is hereby closed and stopped up. According as said street is shown on Plan M175 in the Office of Land Titles at the City of North Bay.

(b) Rose Avenue and Lorne Avenue between McLeod Street and O'Brien Street according to said Plan M175, be, and the same are hereby closed and stopped up.


(c) That all the lanes within the following boundaries:- High Street on the South, ~~City Limits on the South~~, City Limits on the north, McLeod Street on the west and O'Brien Street on the east according to the said Plan M175, be and the same are hereby closed and stopped up.

2. That forthwith upon this By-Law taking effect the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay shall convey the said lanes and streets as closed and stopped up under the next preceding section to North Bay College for the consideration of the sum of \$10.00.

3. That the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay shall hear in person or by his or her solicitor, counsel or agent, any person who claims that his or her lands will be prejudicially affected by this By-Law, and who applies to be heard.

4. That this By-Law shall take effect upon the passing thereof and after notice of the same has been published once a week for four consecutive weeks as provided by the Statutes in that behalf.
