

BY-LAW NO. 1527.

BEING A BY-LAW to fix the Polling Places and appoint Deputy Returning Officers and Poll Clerks for the holding of Municipal Elections for the year 1948, in the Municipality of North Bay.

WHEREAS it is necessary to pass a By-Law fixing Polling Places and appointing Deputy Returning Officers and Poll Clerks for the purpose of taking the vote of the Electors, to select a Mayor and Ten (10) Aldermen (to be elected by General Vote) to transact the Municipal Affairs of the City and for the selection of Three Public School Trustees and One Hydro Commissioner to be elected by General Vote.

THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

18. THAT Polling Place No. 18 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in Mr. F. Elston's residence, 381 McIntyre St. East, and Mrs G. McEwen is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer, and Mrs. J. Moore, Poll Clerk.
19. THAT Polling Place No. 19 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in Mr. C. D. McLeod's residence, 637 Main Street East, and Mrs E. Setchell is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer, and Mrs R. Davidson, Poll Clerk.
20. THAT Polling Place No. 20 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in Mr. E. J. Corbeil's residence, 605 Worthington St. East, and Mr. S. Brouse is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer, and Mrs D. Strange, Poll Clerk.
21. THAT Polling Place No. 21 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in Mr. A. Jarvis' residence, 967 Regina Street, and Mrs. K. McDonald is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer, and Mrs. R. Yeandle, Poll Clerk.
22. THAT Polling Place No. 22, for the purpose of the said Election shall be in Mr. L. F. Taylor's residence, 1103 Regina Street, and Mrs. S. Ross is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer, and Mrs. E. R. McDonald, Poll Clerk.

THAT the Railway Employees, Express Messengers, Truck Drivers, Bus Drivers and Commercial Travellers, Advance Polling Place for the purpose of the said Election shall be in the City Hall, McIntyre & Ferguson Sts., and Mr. Frank Elston is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mr. Chas. Beaton, Poll Clerk.
24. THAT the City Clerk shall attend the Council Chamber at the hour of Twelve O'Clock Noon on the 15th day of December A.D. 1948, for the final summing up of the Number of Votes for the Mayor and Aldermen, School Trustees and Hydro Commissioner.
