

BY-LAW NUMBER 526

BEING a By-law to authorize the levying of a rate of taxation for the Town of North Bay to meet the necessary expenditure for the year 1918.

WHEREAS it is necessary that a sufficient amount of money be raised by taxation, to meet the necessary expenses of the Town of North Bay, for the year 1918.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED, and it is hereby enacted by the Municipal Council of the Town of North Bay, as follows;-

1. THAT a rate of ^{15/100} $12\frac{7}{10}$ mills on the dollar for general purposes be levied on all the taxable property of the Municipality of the said Town of North Bay, as per the Assessment Roll for the year 1918, as finally revised and passed.
2. THAT a rate of ^{37/100} $3\frac{3}{10}$ mills on the dollar for Collegiate Institute Purposes be levied on all the taxable property of the Municipality of the said Town of North Bay, as per the Assessment Roll for the year 1918, as finally revised and passed.
3. THAT a rate of ^{16/100} 9 mills on the dollar for Public School purposes be levied on all the taxable property of the Public School supporters in the Municipality of the said Town of North Bay, as per the Assessment Roll for the year 1918, as finally revised and passed.
4. THAT a rate of ^{10/100} 9 mills on the dollar for Separate School purposes be levied on all the taxable property of the Separate School supporters in the Municipality of the said Town of North Bay, as per the Assessment Roll for the year 1918, as finally revised and passed.
5. THAT a rate of ^{10/100} 1 mill on the dollar for Ontario Government War Tax be levied on all the taxable property of the Municipality of the said Town of North Bay, as per the Assessment Roll for the year 1918, as finally revised and passed.

6. That a rate of / mills on the dollar for Insurance of Soldiers, and grants to the Canadian Red Cross ~~Fund and Canadian Patriotic Fund~~ ^{Purposes} be levied on all the taxable property of the Municipality of the said Town of North Bay, as per the Assessment Roll for the year 1918, as finally revised and passed.
