## BY-LAW NO. 2103

BEING A BY-LAW of the Corporation of the City of North Bay for closing certain lanes in the City of North Bay as shown on Registered Plan No. 93 in the Registry Office for the District of Nipissing.

WHEREAS the Council of the City of North Bay deems it advisable to close certain lanes shown on Registered Plan 93 and lying within the limits of the said Corporation of the City of North Bay and to sell and convey the same to the owner of the adjoining lands.

AND WHEREAS notice of the intention of the Corporation of the City of North Bay to close same has been published once a week for four consecutive weeks in the local newspaper.

AND WHERFAS the said Council has undertaken to hear in person or by their counsel, solicitor or agent, any person who claims that his or her lands will be prejudicially affected by this By-law and who applies to be heard, and no person has so applies.

NOW THEREFORE THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. THAT all and singular that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the City of North Bay in the District of Nipissing and being composed of:

FIRSTLY, that part of a lane lying between a straight line joining the southeast corner of lot 265 with the northeast corner of lot 264 and a straight line joining the southwest corner of lot 280 with the northwest corner of lot 255 all as shown on the said plan, and

SECONDLY, that part of a lane lying between a straight line joining the northwest corner of lot 268 with the northeast corner of lot 277 and a straight line joining the southwest corner of lot 260 with the southeast corner of lot 259, all as shown on the said plan, be and the same is hereby closed and stopped up.

2. THAT the said part of the said lane be properly described for purposes of registration and be made the subject of a conveyance from the City of North Bay to the owner of the lands adjoining same.
