

BY-LAW NO.1757

BEING a By-Law to provide for the submission of a certain question for the assent of the qualified electors of the City of North Bay and to appoint a day on which to take a vote thereon and to name the places where votes are to be taken and to appoint Deputy Returning officers to take the vote at each such place.

WHEREAS the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay deems it advisable to submit to the vote of the electors of the Corporation, the following question:

- (a) Are you in favour of the adding of fluorine to the water supply of the City of North Bay?

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

(1) That there shall be submitted to the electors of the City of North Bay; the following question:

- (a) Are you in favour of the adding of fluorine to the water supply of the City of North Bay?

(2) That the vote of the said electors shall be taken on the said question at the same time and places and by the Deputy Returning Officers and Poll Clerks, as the Annual Municipal Elections.

(3) That a true copy of the question shall be published in the North Bay Nugget on the days hereinafter mentioned, that is to say on the Seventh, Fourteenth and Twenty-first days of November, 1955.

(4) On the 29th day of November at his office in the Council Chambers, on Ferguson Street, in the City of North Bay at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, the Mayor will in writing, signed by him, appoint two persons to attend the Final Summing up of the votes by the Clerk of the Corporation, and one person to attend each Polling Place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of promoting the acceptance of the said question, and a like number on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of the rejection of the said question.

(5) The Fourteenth day of December at the said Council Chambers at 12 o'clock in the forenoon is hereby appointed as the time and place for summing up by the Clerk of this Corporation of the number of votes given in the affirmative and in the negative, respectively.
