

BY-LAW NO. 2004

BEING A BY-LAW of the Corporation of the City of North Bay to authorize the construction and equipping of an addition to the North Bay Civic Hospital.

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary to construct and equip said addition to provide fifty five (55) active treatment beds, forty (40) chronic Beds, eight (8) post anaesthetic beds, two (2) emergency beds and five (5) additional beds (equivalent of 15 bassinets) and to renovate for the purpose of relocating, enlarging and expanding the present auxiliary services accordingly, and



WHEREAS in accordance with the provisions of Chap. 112, Section 6, S.O. 1931, the assent of the electors qualified to vote on money by-laws was obtained by ballot on the 11th day of December 1961 for the said construction and equipping of an addition to the North Bay Civic Hospital, and

WHEREAS it is expedient to borrow for the said construction, equipping and renovating of the North Bay Civic Hospital the sum of \$1,519,447.16 being the net amount after deducting Federal and Provincial grants.



THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. THAT under authority of the Municipal Act, Chap. 249, Sec. 377, Para. 35 R.S.O. 1960 and subject to the provisions of the Public Hospitals Act, Chap. 322, Sec. 4(4), R.S.O. 1960, the North Bay Civic Hospital Commission be given authority to construct and equip an addition to the North Bay Civic Hospital to provide fifty-five (55) active treatment beds, forty (40) chronic beds, eight (8) post anaesthetic beds, two (2) emergency beds and five (5) additional beds (equivalent of 15 bassinets) and to renovate for the purpose of relocating, enlarging and expanding the present auxiliary services subject to approval by the North Bay City Council by resolution.
2. THAT the North Bay Civic Hospital Commission shall forthwith make such plans and specifications as may be necessary for the calling of tenders, and for the making of a contract for the execution of the work.
3. THAT the work shall be carried on and executed under the supervision and according to the direction of the North Bay Civic Hospital Commission, or it's architect.
4. THAT the Treasurer of the City of North Bay may, subject to the approval of the Council, agree with any bank or person for temporary advances of money to meet the cost of construction pending completion of such construction.
5. THAT the debentures to be issued for the loan to be effected to pay for the cost of this work shall bear interest at such rate as the Council may determine, and the debenture principal and the debenture interest be made payable within twenty years on the installment plan.
6. THAT this By-law shall become effective only on the final passing, after approval in writing has been secured from the Ontario Municipal Board by virtue of Sec. 64 of the Ontario Municipal Board Act, Chap. 274, R.S.O. 1960.

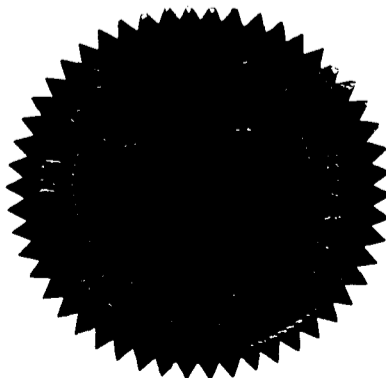

THE BOARD ORDERS, under and in pursuance of the
legislation hereinbefore referred to, and of any and all
other powers vested in the Board, that the said applica-
tion be and the same is hereby granted, and that the said
Corporation may now proceed with the said undertaking, and
for such purpose may pass all requisite by-laws, including
by-laws providing for the issue of debentures repayable
over a term of not more than twenty years, and may borrow
money to the extent sufficient to provide an amount not
exceeding \$1,519,447.16 therefor, provided that the Cor-
poration in exercising any of its powers approved by this
order shall comply with all statutory and other legal
requirements relating thereto.
