Special Review Committee Chair, George Maroosis, called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

Items Discussed:

1. Review and approval of September 14, 2015 Minutes of the Special Review Committee – Water Rates.

- 3. Effective January 1, 2016 water rates will no longer be based on property classes but will be based on size of the water meter.
- 4. Policy re: Water Meter Size Rate:
 - David Euler provided a handout and went through the process in which a customer can make an application to the City to adjust their water meter size.
 - Councillor Maroosis suggested that all Applications should come before Council in order that Council can determine what applications are be approved.
 - Mayor McDonald does not agree that a user fee should be charged for the Application within the first year.
 - Councillor Bain suggested that large water users be advised of this policy.
- 5. Policy re: Frozen Water Lines and "Brown" Water:
 - David Euler provided a handout and the current process in place re: frozen water lines and brown water.
- 6. Declining Block Structure:
 - Margaret Karpenko provided a handout entitled Assumptions and went through a declining block structure with examples.
 - A declining block structure will not be introduced.

- 7. Conservation/Subsidy/Assistance Programs
 - Margaret Karpenko provided a handout entitled Incentive Programs Review which showed a comparison of various municipal programs.
 - The following was discussed as criteria for the rebate:
 - > The rebate will be \$50.00
 - > Limit set at 1 per household
 - Original receipt required
 - Only for replacement, new construction does not qualify
 - > Toilet must be paid for and installed prior to rebate
 - > First come first serve basis
 - Must be connected to Municipal water system
 - Possible inspection by a municipal employee to ensure installation has taken place
 - Replacement toilets must be from EcoEnergy Eligible Model List
 - ➤ Replacement toilet have to have been purchased in 2016
 - The application for rebate will be on the City's website to be completed and returned to the water department.
 - The rebate will be shown on the water bill.
 - Assistance Programs will be looked at in the future.
 - This program will be funded from water capital reserve for an amount of up to \$100,000.00.
- 8. Capital costs or Firefighting costs transferred to Property Tax Budget:
 - The Committee agreed that this is a matter that the Council should be reviewing during the budget process
