BY-LAW NO. 2002-118

BEING A BY-LAW TO AMEND TRAFFIC BY-LAW NO. 131-93, AS AMENDED SCHEDULE 2, SECTION F (NO PARKING AREAS)

WHEREAS the *MunicipalAct*, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter M-45, as amended, authorizes the Council to pass By-laws regulating or prohibiting certain traffic on highways and regulating or prohibiting parking on highways;

AND WHEREAS the *Highway Traffic Act*, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter H-8, as amended, authorizes the Council to pass By-laws regulating traffic on highways;

AND WHEREAS the amendments to Schedule 2, Section F (No Parking Areas) to Traffic By-law were authorized by Council Resolution No. 2002-250 passed by Council at its Regular Meeting held on Monday, May 6,2002.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That Part 1 Definitions to Traffic By-law No. 131-93 is hereby amended by deleting (w) "Parking Meter" and inserting the following in lieu thereof:
 - (w) "Parking Meter" or "Pay and Display Machine" means a device which indicates the length of time during which a vehicle may be parked, which has as a part thereof a receptacle for receiving and storing coins, a slot or place in which such coins may be deposited, a timing mechanism to indicate the passage of the interval of which the parking is permissible and which displays a signal when said interval of time has elapsed or which produces a ticket to show the time for which parking is permitted and includes a Pay and Display Machine or Parking Machine.
- 2. That Schedule 2, Section F to Traffic By-law No. 131-93 is hereby amended by adding the following:

3. That this by-law comes into effect upon being passed.
