BY-LAW NO.1762

A BY-LAW TO AMEND THE BY-LAW #1519 BEING A BY-LAW TO AUTHORIZE A COMMUNITY PROGRAMME UNDER THE REGULATIONS REGARDING PHYSICAL FITNESS AND RECREATION PURSUANT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

WHEREAS the council of the City of North Bay deems it advisable to repeal Paragraph #2 of By-Law #1519.

THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That Paragraph #2 of By-Law #1519 of the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay is hereby repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof.
 - "2 (a) A local Committee to be known as the the North Bay Recreation Committee (and which is hereinafter referred to as "The Recreation Committee") is hereby constituted. The Recreation Committee shall be comprised of a Committee of five members appointed by resolution of the North Bay City Council, together with the Mayor of the Corporation or his appointee and the Chairman of the Community Services Committee, as representatives of City Council. The original five members shall be appointed by resolution of the Council of the City of North Bay and shall hold office for periods as follows:
 - (a) The first two of such original appointees shall hold office for a period of three years.
 - (b) The second two of such original appointees shall hold office for a period of two years.
 - (c) The fifth of such original appointees shall hold office for a period of one year.

Each year, an appropriate number of new members shall be appointed to the committee for a period of three years to replace the retiring member or members of the said Committee."

- "2 (b) Should a vacancy occur on the said Committee through death or resignation of any member or members, the Council of the City of North Bay shall appoint by resolution, a new member to complete the term of office of such member or members.
- 2. This By-Law shall come into force and take effect on the day of its final reading.
