BY IAW NO. 1.4. 3.8. Arrender Jak

TO PROVIDE FOR THE CLEANING OF THE STREETS OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY AND FOR THE COLLECTION OF WASTE.

THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. For the purpose of this by-law, the following words shall have the meaning given herein;

GARBAGE - DEFINITION OF amended Que Brillaw 115%

(A) "GARBAGE" shall mean all rejected, abandoned, or discarded household waste, either animal or vegetable, wearing apparel, sweepings, and all refuse matter capable of consumption by fire; except "ashes". XBut in the case of any hotel, restaurant, or apartment house with restaurant in connection, requiring more than two collections of garbage per week, "garbage" shall mean table and kitchen waste consisting of animal and vegetable matter only, with which no other waste product or material shall be mixed.

ASHES - DEFINITION OF amended Du By haw 1458

(B) "ASHES" shall mean the residue of any household fuel after such fuel has been consumed by fire, and tins, bottles, metals, crockery and glass.

HOUSEHOLDER - DEFINITION OF

(C) "HOUSEHOLDER" shall mean any owner, occupant, lessee, tenant, or any person in charge of any dwelling, hotel, restaurant, apartment house, office building, public institution, or other building.

DWELLING - DEFINITION OF

(D) "DWELLING" shall mean any building or place occupied or used as a place of abode, other than an hotel, restaurant, apartment house, tenement or building in which more than two families dwell, abide, or live, or which contains more than two separate places of dwelling, abode, or living

STREET - DEFINITION OF

(E) "STREET" shall mean any public highway, road, street, lane, alley, square, place, thoroughfare or way within the City of North Bay.

amended Dec 134 haw 1458 2. (A) THE sanitation Department and all equipment used by that Departmen shall be under the charge of The Assistant City Foreman.

(E)^b PROVIDED that extra, additional or special removals or service may be provided upon application to the City Clerk and shall be charged as per Schedule attached to this by-law and all such special or extra or additional services shall be paid in advance.

(C) ALL waste or refuse from butcher shops, grocery stores, restaurant hotels and other places of business, must be kept in properly covered water tight metallic receptacles (as defined in Section 5 of this by-law) and must be kept so covered as to prevent the ingress or egress of flies, and the escape of offensive odors.

OFFAL FROM BUTCHER SHOPS & SLAUGHTER HOUSES

3. NO personal shall convey through the streets any manure, garbage, offal or waste from butcher shops, or slaughter houses, or any waste or organic matter whatever, except in properly covered metallic receptacles, or otherwise, in carts, wagons, or vehicles, covered with canvas or tarpaulins, so fastened down around the edges as to prevent any of the contents falling upon the streets, and to protect the same from flies, and to control, so far as possible, the escape of any offensive odors therefrom.

THROWING OF REFUSE ON TO ROADWAYS

4. NO person shall sweep, throw, cast, lay or direct, or suffer or permit any servant, agent, or employee, to sweep, throw, cast, lay, pla or deposit any ashes, offal, vegetables, garbage, fruit skins, dross, cinders, shells, straw, excelsior, shavings, paper, dirt, dilth, lawn rakings, grass clippings, broken glassware, hand bills, crockery, bottles, carcass of any animal or rubbish of any kind whatsoever, on or in any street except that ashes, cinders, sand or sawdust may be lightly sprinkled on slipper sidewalks or streets as a measure of safety.

PROPER RECEPTACLES TO BE PROVIDED BY HOUSEHOLDER.

5. EVERY householder shall provide and maintain in proper order and repair for the dwelling occupied by him, covered metal, receptacles of circular design, having a capaciay of not more than two cubic feet, each, which shall not be filled to a greater height than within two inches of the top.

SUFFICIENT NUMBER OF RECEPTACLES TO BE PROVIDED

6. RECEPTACLES shall be provided and maintained in good condition, in sufficient numbers to contain all ashes, kitchen or table waste produced in, or emanating from every dwelling, hotel, restaurant, apartment house, public institution, or other premises, and each receptacle shall be provided with a good watertight cover, which shall at all times remain in position, so as to preclude ingress or egress of flies, or the escape of odors therefrom.

KITCHEN WASTE TO BE STRAINED

7. HOUSEHOLDERS shall thoroughly strain all table and kitchen waste before placing it in garbage receptacles, and no such refuse of the consistency of swill shall be collected from any premises whatsoever by the Garbage Collection.

CONTENTS OF GARBAGE CANS NOT TO BE MIXED WITH CONTENTS OF ASH CANS

8. HOUSEHOLDERS shall deposit in one can, or set of cans, all material defined as "garbage", and in another can, or set of cans, all material defined as "ashes", as indicated in the foregoing sections. AND the contents of any garbage receptacle, or receptacles, shall not be deposited in or mixed with the contents of any ash receptacle, or receptacles, or vice versa, but each class of material as above specified shall be kept separately.

RECEPTACLES TO BE KEPT ON PREMISES (ADJOINING LANE (IF ANY)) amended Are (March 145% SUCH receptacles shall at all times be kept on a portion of the premises of, or connected with, the dwelling of the householder, and % on the days of collection shall be placed immediately adjoining the lane (if there be a lane) and from such lane there shall be provided, a gate, door or entrance, of such size and character as to permit of ready access to such receptacles. In all such cases the receptacle, or receptacles, shall be placed at such gate, door or entrance, and such gate door or entrance, shall be untastened or unlocked to allow any employee of the Garbage Collection Department to obtain access (on the regular days of collection) to such receptacles, for the purpose of emptying and returning the same, and such household shall on such days, permit and allow any employee of the Department of Garbage Collection to have access to, and to empty and return such receptacle or receptacles.

9. No receptacle shall be permitted to remain on the street, or in front of premises served, for an unreasonable length of time after collection has been effected.

PICKING OVER OR DISTURBING REFUSE DEPOSITED FOR COLLECTION

10. No person shall pick over, interfere with, disturb, remove, or scatter, any bundle of paper, or any article so placed for removal, whether contained in receptacles, or otherwise, except and until the same is removed by the Sanitation Department.

EMPLOYEES PROHIBITED FROM ENTERING BUILDING & DEMANDING PAYMENT

11. IN no circumstances shall any employee of the Department of Garbage Collection enter any private dwelling, apartment house, hotel, or tenement or ascend or descend any stairway, or enter any elevator, hoist, or lift, for the purpose of carrying out or returning thereto, any receptacle, nor shall he demand any gratuity, gift, payment, or consideration for services rendered beyond his regular way.

AS TO OTHER BUILDINGS. Ale Buil (1441 as amended by 1458

12. ALL ashes (but not including the residue of steam power plants) and rubbish shall also be removed by the Sanitation Department from all other buildings in the City, to the extent of 12 cubic feet per call (the contents of six regulation receptacles) from each building, and any additional quantity, if removed, shall be charged for at special service rates.

CONDEMNED PRODUCTS & MANUFACTURERS' WASTE NOT TO BE REMOVED FREE OF CHARGE

13. THE Sanitation Department shall not cdlect any abandoned, condemned or rejected product, bi-product, manufacturers' waste material, or the stock of any wholesale or retail dealer, as for example, eggs, fish, pickles, fruit or vegetables, and which shall be regarded as trade waste unless paid for under special service rates.

QUANTITES OF PAPER CONTAINED IN RECEPTACLES, AND WRAPPING OF GARBAGE IN PAPER.

14. NOTWITHSTANDING the separation of "ashes" and "Garbage" as defined in Section 8 of this by-law, householders shall be required to strain and wrap all table and kitchen waste in paper, and to deposit such parcels in the "garbage" receptacle. This section does not, however, apply to hotels, restaurants, boarding houses, or to any other place where the quantity contained in receptacles would multiply the number of receptacles to the extent of requiring the occupant, owner or lessee of such place to more than one collection per week.

RECEPTACIES NOT TO BE PLACED ON PUBLIC STREETS UNLESS AUTHORIZED (15) It shall be unlawful for any person to place any waste paper, garbage or ash receptacle upon or in any street unless the same is expressly authorized by the sanitation repartment, and such use of any street shall only be authorized or permitted when the said Department deems it expedient and in the interests of the City to so place such receptacles in order to avoid danger, unreasonable inconvenience or to facilitate collection. And in every case where the base of any street, as aforesaid is expressly authorized, it shall be the duty of the householder, owner, occupant, or other person in charge or the dwelling, building, institution or premises served, to forthwith remove the receptacle after collection of its contents has been effect.

16. In no case (where the use of the public street is not expressly authorized) shall any householder, penant, occupant, or person in charge of any dwelling, hotel, restaurant, public or charitable institution or building of any nature whatsoever, place any garbage shes, rubbish or other waste material or paper nearer to the street line than three feet back from the front line or angle and not more than 50 feet back from street line and must be within view from the street, of any such dwelling, hotel, restaurant, public or charitable institution, or building, and then only on the days of collection when all such materials shall be contained in proper covered receptacles, as defined in Section 5 of this by-law, except waste paper, which shall be securely tied in bundles and placed adjacent to receptacles on collection days.

DANGER OR INCENVENIENT LOCATIONS FOR RECEPTACLES

17. IN no instance shall Sanitation Department be called upon to make collections from, or return receptacles to, any point which in the opinion of the Sanitation Department is unreasonable, inconvenient or dangerous to its employees; nor shall it be required to remove receptacles from any point other than that designated bat it, and then only when such receptacles are in accordance with the requirements of Section 5 of this by-law; special services such as going into basements and upstairs etc. may be secured whene necessary on application and payment for such required services as provided unler Section 2B of this by-law.

VEHICLES ENGAGED IN CONVEYING EARTH AND OTHER MATERIAL FROM EXCAVATIONS.

18. ALL persons employing or using carts, wagons, or other vehicles in making excavations for building purposes and in conveying earth, rubbish, or other material from such excavations, or from any public place where the same may be deposited, all earth, rubbish, or other material that may fall from the wheels of, or from such carts, wagons or vehicles, and shall employ and keep employed a sufficient number of sweepers or workmen, or use such other means as may be necessary to keep all such pavements and sidewalks in a clean condition and free from earth or other material.

UFFICERS OF CORPORATION TO ASSIST STREET COMMISSIONER.

19. IT shall be the duty of all officers, servants, workmen and agents of the Corporation to give all possible aid and assistance in their power to the Sanitation Department in carrying out the provisions of this by-law.

CLASS OF MATERIAL TO BE REMOVED & CLASS OF RECEPTACLES TO BE FROVIDED

20. THE decision of the Sanitation Department shall be final as to quantites and class of material to be moved, also as to whether or not a receptacle or the place of the same meets the requirements of the Department.

Unicuded Que 131 Law 1458 21. THE DISPOSAL OF GARBAGE IN ORDINARY TURNACES or open air incinerators is prohibited.

FENALTY

22.

ANY person convicted of a breach of any of the provisions of this bylaw shall forfeit and pay, at the discretion of the convicting magistrate a penalty of not less than one dollar and not exceeding (exclusive of costs) the sum of fifty dollars for each such offence.

25. THAT for the purpose of providing a means of paying the expenses of carrying out the provisions of this bylaw an annual rate on the dollar upon the assessed value of all the land in the City of North Bay over and above all other rates and taxes, sufficient to produce in each year a sum to pay the necessary expenses of carrying out the provisions of this bylaw, shall be annually rated and levied against the said lands and collected from year to year while this bylaw remains in force, in the same manner as other taxes of the said City are collected, for the purpose of paying the expenses of carrying out the provisions of this bylaw, and for no other purpose whatever. 24. HOUSEHOLDERS of the Township of widdifield may apply to the Clerk of the municipality and obtain services from the Sanitation Department at rates as provided in Schedule hereto attached.

25. ALL bylaws of the City of North Bay inconsistent with the provisions of this by-law are hereby repealed.
