

SUBJECT: 2012-2014 Commercial Water and Sewage Rates for dispensing of bulk

water and septage disposal at the new facility on Patton Road.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

(1) That water rates payable for the supply of water from the dispensing facility be set at \$3.60/1,000 gallons as outlined in "Schedule A section 3 (c) of bylaw 2011-233".

(2) That the sewage rates payable for the dumping of sewage loads to the facility be set at \$10/1,000 gallons and to increase \$5/1,000 gallons for years 2013 and 2014.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

In 2011 the City of North Bay constructed a new facility to handle the dispensing of bulk water and septage disposal on Patton Road. Currently contractors are permitted to utilize Public Works facilities to acquire bulk water and Memorial Drive is used to dump the septage loads.

Access to both the Public Works facility and to the Memorial Drive dumping facility will be closing by the end of June and access to the new dispensing facility will commence.

#### **OPTIONS/ANALYSIS:**

Option 1 - Proceed with the Authorizing By-Law

Approve the proposed water dispensing rate and sewage disposal rate as set out in the recommendation.

#### **BY-LAW NO. 2011-233**

BEING A BY-LAW TO ESTABLISH RATES OR CHARGES FOR THE SUPPLY OF WATER AND SANITARY SEWER BY THE CITY OF NORTH BAY FOR DOMESTIC, COMMERCIAL AND MANUFACTURING USE, AND INCLUDING OTHER RELATED MATTERS (AND TO REPEAL BY-LAW NO. 2011-10)

WHEREAS the Water Filtration Surcharge implemented effective July 1, 2003, has been calculated based on the requirement to fund a net City share for the Water Filtration Plant;

**AND WHEREAS** Notice of the Public Meeting in the matter of proposed amendments to existing water and sanitary sewer rates was given by advertisement in the North Bay Nugget on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of October, 2011 and on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2011;

**AND WHEREAS** a Public Meeting under the *Municipal Act* in the matter of the proposed amendments to the existing water rates and sanitary sewer rates was held on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of November, 2011;

**AND WHEREAS** Council authorized the by-law to set 2011 tax rates and to levy taxes for the year 2011 by General Government Committee Report No. 2011-07, passed on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2011;

AND WHEREAS by General Government Committee Report No. 2011-18 passed by Council at its Regular Meeting held on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2011, Council directed that all water rates be raised by 16%, and that the sanitary sewer charge be reduced from 106% to 86% of the water charges;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

#### **DEFINITIONS:**

- For the purpose of this By-Law:
  - a) "City" shall mean The Corporation of the City of North Bay;
  - "Consumer" shall mean the owner of any property or portion thereof situated in the City of North Bay;
  - "Dwelling Unit" shall mean a room or suite of rooms occupied or capable of being occupied as an independent and separate housekeeping establishment;
  - d) "Property" shall mean land and premises or any portion thereof which is supplied with water by the City;
  - e) "Retirement Home/Residence" shall mean a building designated for residents thereof in which lodging is supplied with meals, homecare, nursing, medical, or similar care and treatment if required. A Retirement Home/Residence may contain independent and separate housekeeping units which include culinary facilities, provided that these units are ancillary to the main facility from which the residents receive service.
- 2. The monthly rates or charges for the supply of water by the City of domestic, commercial and manufacturing use are hereby established in accordance with the rates or charges set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of this By-Law.
- 3. a) The monthly rates or charges payable by a consumer for the supply of water for

- b) The following types of construction shall be exempt from the construction water charges:
  - i) Construction outside of serviced areas:
  - ii) Renovations to residential units; and,
  - Renovations and additions to all buildings which pay water charges on a metered rate.
- 8. a) Accounts for the rates or charges for the supply of water by flat rate shall be payable by the consumer every four months with payment due in the month following each such period.
  - b) The Treasurer may accept payments on the due date, via direct debit from the Bank or Trust Company account of a customer in good standing, where such customer has previously authorized cheques for the purpose of payment of the said water accounts.
  - c) The Treasurer shall cause at least ten days notice to be given to the consumer of the due date:
    - i) of each flat rate account, on a tri-annual basis;
    - ii) of each metered account, on not less than a quarterly basis; and,
    - iii) of each pre-authorized chequing account, on an annual basis.
  - d) The Treasurer may accept a direction from a consumer that notice of the account shall be given to a tenant of the consumer to be in full satisfaction of notice to consumer.
- A sanitary sewer rate is hereby imposed upon the owners or occupants of lands which are supplied with sewage service.
- 10. The sanitary sewer rate imposed by Section 9 shall be a charge on the water bill charged or chargeable in respect of such lands and shall be computed as eighty-six per centum (86%) of the annual water rates or charges charged or chargeable in respect of such land where such lands are used for other than commercial and industrial purposes and not less than eighty-six per centum (86%) of the annual water rates or charges charged or chargeable in respect of such lands where such lands are used for commercial or industrial purposes.
- 11. The Treasurer shall charge an associated fee as specified in the City's User Fee By-Law No. 2007-115, as amended, to any accounts for which payment was tendered by cheque where such cheque is not honoured by the Bank or Trust Company named on such cheque.
- 12. All water accounts, sanitary sewer accounts and special fees shall be subject to a percentage charge payable by the consumer as a penalty for non-payment of water accounts or any part thereof of one and one-quarter percent (1.25%) on the first day of the calendar month immediately following the due date and on the first day of each calendar month thereafter in which default continues.
- 13. The Clerk shall, upon notice from the City Treasurer of the amount due and the person by whom it is due and of the lands upon which any work was done or furnished the supply of water, enter any such unpaid amounts as fixed by Schedule "A" attached hereto for such service or work upon the Collector's Roll and collect them in the same manner as taxes.
- 14. In circumstances where a property is exempt from taxation and is serviced with water and sanitary sewer, the City may shut off the supply of water to the land if fees and charges payable by the owners or occupants of the land for the supply of the water and sanitary sewer to the land are overdue.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

That North Bay City Council approves the award of a contract to DS Contracting in the amount of \$124,565.00 (excluding HST) for replacement of the boardwalk at the Waterfront Marina and the beachfront at Marathon Beach.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The wooden boardwalk in front of the Waterfront Marina and the beachfront at Marathon Beach is nearing the end of its useful life and in need of replacement. The boardwalk will be replaced using pressure treated wood similar to the current structure. The boardwalk is approximately 1050 feet in length with widths varying from 10 to 18 feet.

A tender was publicly advertised in accordance with the City's Purchasing Policy. Thirteen (13) tender packages were distributed. The tender closed May 3, 2012. Seven (7) tenders were received and evaluated by the Facilities and Parking Supervisor, the Marina Supervisor and the Manager of Purchasing. The results are as follows:

The tender provided by DS Contracting in the amount \$124,565.00 (excluding HST) is considered fair and reasonable.

#### **ANALYSIS / OPTIONS:**

- 1. Award a contract to DS Contracting for replacement of the boardwalk.
- 2. Do not award a contract. This option is not recommended. The boardwalk is at the end of its useful life. Ongoing maintenance and repairs will be required to keep the boardwalk safe and in use.

#### **RECOMMENDED OPTION/FINANCIAL IMPACTS:**

Option 1 is recommended as follows:

That North Bay City Council approves the award of a contract to DS Contracting in the amount of \$124,565.00 (excluding HST) for replacement of the boardwalk at the Waterfront Marina and the beachfront at Marathon Beach.

Sufficient funds have been allocated and exist in the following capital projects:

- An amount of \$91,200.00 remains in the 2012 Community Services Capital Budget, Project No. 6072PR; authorized with By-law No. 2012-30 dated February 6, 2012.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

That North Bay City Council approves the award of a contract to Venasse Construction Limited in the amount of \$923,000.00 (excluding HST) for the construction of a new maintenance building at Lee Park.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

This project entails the complete replacement of the existing Lee Park maintenance building. The facility no longer provides for the necessary operational requirements of the current Parks Department. The present building is expensive to maintain and operate and deemed as cost prohibitive to renovate or enlarge. The new building will provide appropriate sized offices, lunchroom, work areas, and washrooms. It will also offer improved accessibility and energy efficiencies. This project provides for the construction of a new building only. Subsequent projects will include the demolition of the existing building, the creation of a new parking compound, and repairs to the remaining metal Butler building onsite.

A Request for Proposal for the design/build of a new maintenance building at Lee Park was issued on March 31, 2012. The RFP was publicly advertised in accordance with the City's Purchasing Policy. Twenty-three (23) packages were distributed. The RFP closed on May 4, 2012. Three (3) proposals were received and evaluated by the Facilities and Parking Supervisor, the Chief Building Official, the Manager of Parks, and the Manager of Purchasing. The evaluation considers both merit and price. The results are as follows:

The proposal provided by Venasse Construction Limited in the amount \$923,000.00 (excluding HST) is considered fair and reasonable.

#### **ANALYSIS / OPTIONS:**

- 1. Award a contract to Venasse Construction Limited for the design/build of a new maintenance facility at Lee Park.
- 2. Do not award a contract. This option is not recommended. The current building no longer meets the operational requirements of the Parks Department and deemed cost prohibitive to renovate or enlarge.

#### RECOMMENDED OPTION / FINANCIAL IMPACTS:

Option 1 is recommended as follows:

That North Bay City Council approves the award of a contract to Venasse Construction Limited. in the amount of \$923,000.00 (excluding HST) for the construction of a new maintenance building at Lee Park.

An amount of \$1,300,000 has been allocated in the 2012 Community Services Capital Budget, Project No. 6068PR; authorized with By-law No. 2012-20 dated February 6, 2012.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

That North Bay City Council approves the award of a contract to Read Jones Christoffersen Ltd. in the amount of \$104,400.00 (excluding HST) for engineering services related to the rehabilitation of the McIntyre Street Parking Garage.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

In 2010, the City hired the firm of Read Jones Christoffersen Ltd. to complete a condition assessment to the McIntyre Street Parking Garage. The report indicated the need for repair and replacement of areas of structural precast elements, slab waterproofing, anchoring systems, and drainage. The City completed minor immediate repairs in 2011 to allow for the Parking Garage to remain operational until the remaining rehabilitation is completed in 2012.

A Request for Proposal for engineering services for the rehabilitation was issued on February 8, 2012. This scope of services includes all necessary testing, preparation of specifications, drawings, tender documents, tendering, contract administration, and construction review services required to address all issues identified in the 2010 Parking Garage Condition Assessment Report. The RFP also requested a Life Cycle Assessment Report to assist with long term capital planning for the parking structure.

An RFP was publicly advertised in accordance with the City' Purchasing Policy. Seventeen (17) packages were distributed. The RFP closed on March 7, 2012. Seven (7) proposals were received and evaluated by the Facilities and Parking Supervisor, Engineering, and the Manager of Purchasing. The evaluation considers both merit and price. The results are as follows:

- 1. Award a contract to Read Jones Christoffersen Ltd. for engineering services related to the McIntyre Street Parking Garage Rehabilitation.
- 2. Do not award a contract. This option is not recommended. The 2010 Parking Garage Condition Assessment Report indicates rehabilitation is necessary in maintaining use of the Parking Garage.

#### **RECOMMENDED OPTION / FINANCIAL IMPACTS:**

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Option 1 is recommended as follows:

That North Bay City Council approves the award of a contract to Read Jones Christoffersen Ltd. in the amount of \$104,400.00 (excluding HST) for engineering services related to the rehabilitation of the McIntyre Street Parking Garage.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That a Capital Expenditure By-Law be prepared for the consideration of City Council to authorize the Steve Omischl Sports Field Complex Rehabilitation and Development Program being 2012 Community Services Capital Budget, Project No. 6070PR at a net debenture cost of \$150,000.

#### BACKGROUND

The 2012 Capital Budget included an amount of \$150,000 for the Steve Omischl Sports Field Complex Rehabilitation and Development Program being Community Services Capital Budget, Project No. 6070PR that provides for on-going improvements to the Steve Omischl Sports Field Complex on Lakeshore Drive. This program addresses maintenance and programming needs to provide safe and appropriate playing areas for the public.

The following projects are scheduled for 2012; south parking lot upgrades, vendors' electrical services, and furnishings.

#### South Parking Lot Upgrades

Parking at the Steve Omischl Sports Field Complex is in high demand when programming is scheduled on all fields. Upgrades to the south parking lot will include gravel, grading, and barriers to maximize the size and efficiency of this parking area and therefore provide safer access to the facility.

A Schedule to the proposed by-law is submitted for consideration of Council:

Steve Omischl Sports Field Improvement Costs \$142,500

Financing Costs \$ 7,500

NET DEBENTURE COST \$150,000

#### ANALYSIS / OPTIONS

Option 1 – That a Capital Expenditure By-Law be prepared for the consideration of City Council to authorize the Steve Omischl Sports Field Complex Rehabilitation and Development Program being 2012 Community Services Capital Budget, Project No. 6070PR at a net debenture cost of \$150,000.

Under this option, City Council would authorize the Parks, Recreation and Leisure Services Department to improve the Steve Omischl Sports Field Complex by upgrading the South Parking Lot, providing furnishing for the park and electrical services for vendors.

Option 2 - Cancel the Steve Omischl Sports Field Complex Rehabilitation & Development Program for this year.

This option would delay or cancel the proposed improvements to the maintenance of the Steve Omischl Sports Field Complex.

#### RECOMMENDED OPTION / FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Option 1 - That a Capital Expenditure By-Law be prepared for the consideration of City Council to authorize the Steve Omischl Sports Field Complex Rehabilitation and Development Program being 2012 Community Services Capital Budget, Project No. 6070PR at a net debenture cost of \$150,000.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That a Capital Expenditure By-Law be prepared for the consideration of City Council to authorize the 2012 Transit Capital Program of the 2012 Community Services Capital Budget, Capital Budget Project No. 6081TR at a net debenture cost of \$26,250.

#### BACKGROUND

The 2012 Capital Budget and the 2013 to 2021 Ten Year Capital Forecast includes amounts of \$26,250 each year for Transit Capital Programs. In each year, beginning in 2012, this amount has been allocated for Transit Terminal repair and improvements and shelters for upgrades to AODA Standards.

The Transit Terminal was completed in June of 2007. The cement area surrounding the Transit Terminal and the passenger boarding area has experienced extensive wear and erosion (Spalding). Replacement, repairs and patching are required in cement areas. The Terminal area is outside of Warranty.

Transit is proposing to improve the traffic flow upon entering and exiting the Transit parking area. There is little room to maneuver and vehicles drive in and back out onto the Oak St./Wyld St. corner. The proposal will move the disabled parking spot to a more accessible location, closer to the Customer service entrance. The work is to be undertaken and completed by the Public Works department. Public Works has quoted \$8,378.00 for the work at the front of the building for cement and curb removal with the new drop curb and new asphalt repair along the curb. Two illustrations are attached depicting the present configuration and proposed changes.

The concrete patching required throughout the platform area can only be done on a time and material basis. Public Works is not able to establish a quote for this repair portion of the work. The remainder of the funds will be used to repair the Spalding areas on a worst case basis.

#### **ANALYSIS / OPTIONS**

#### Option 1:

Not to approve a Capital Expenditure By-Law. The transit terminal cement area will continue to erode. There are areas now that are considered Health & Safety concerns as these areas could be trip hazards for customers and employees alike. Not progressing with the repairs and improvements puts the Corporation in a position for injury claims.

#### Option 2:

That a Capital Expenditure By-Law be prepared for the consideration of City Council to authorize the 2012 Transit Capital Program of the 2012 Community Services Capital Budget, Capital Budget Project No. 6081 TR at a net debenture cost of \$26,250.

This would allow the repair of the Transit cement areas and improvement of the Parking entrance and exit and the accessible parking allocation.

#### RECOMMENDED OPTION / FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Option #2 is recommended.

That a Capital Expenditure By-Law be prepared for the consideration of City Council to authorize the 2012 Transit Capital Program of the 2012 Community Services Capital Budget, Capital Budget Project No. 6081TR at a net debenture cost of \$26,250.





#### BY-LAW NO. 2012-95

#### A BY-LAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF SPECIAL CHARGES IN RESPECT OF CERTAIN BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT AREAS

WHEREAS subsection 208.(2) of the *Municipal Act, 2001* (S.O. 2001, c.25), provides that the council of a municipality shall in each year levy a special charge upon rateable property in a business improvement area which has been designated under subsection 204.(1); that is in a prescribed business property class sufficient to provide a sum equal to the sum of money provided for the purposes of the board of management for that area, together with interest on the sum at such rate as is required to repay any interest payable by the municipality on the whole or any part of such sum;

AND WHEREAS by Resolution No. 2012-165 passed by Council at its Regular Meeting held on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2012 the Council approved the 2012 budget for the Board of Management for the Downtown Improvement Area in the amount of \$145,640.00 with a resultant tax levy of \$112,830.00, and that the 2011 surplus of \$10,179.00 be transferred to the Downtown Improvement Area Reserve Fund, and authorized the necessary by-law to provide for the levy and collection of special charges in respect to certain business improvement areas be prepared;

**AND WHEREAS** notice of the passing of this by-law was sent by pre-paid mail to the Board of Management of the Downtown Improvement Area and to every person who, on the last returned roll, is assessed for rateable property that is in a prescribed business class which is located in the improvement area;

**AND WHEREAS** no letters of objection were received from any person who, on the last returned roll, were assessed for rateable property that is in a prescribed business class which is located in the improvement area;

**AND WHEREAS** no letter of objections were received, the municipality may pass By-law No. 2012-95 pursuant to subsection 210.(4) of the *Municipal Act*, 2001 (S.O. 2001, c.25).

# THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

There shall be levied and collected for the purposes of the Board of Management of the Downtown Improvement Area for the year 2012, amounts calculated for each prescribed business property class and subclass set out in Column II, on the assessment of real property in a prescribed business property class rateable for such purposes as set out in Column III, the special charge rate set out on Column IV which shall produce the total special charge for the business improvement area set out in Column V:

- Notwithstanding Section 1 hereof and pursuant to By-Law No. 2011-74, being a By-law to amend By-law No. 1977-144:
  - no person with a business assessment address on Main Street shall pay a special charge levied by the Board of Management of more that \$2,665.00 in one calendar year;
  - (ii) no person with a **business** assessment address **which** is not on Main Street shall pay a **special** charge levied by the Board of Management of more than \$1,600.00 in one calendar year.
- The special charge rated and imposed pursuant to the provisions of the By-Law shall become due and payable in one instalment, namely on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of June. 2012.
- 4. The Tax Collector and the Treasurer of The Corporation of the City of North Bay are hereby authorized to collect the said special charges in the same manner and with the same remedies as provided in the *Municipal Act* for the collection of taxes upon business assessment.
- 5. This by-law comes into force and effect as of and from the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of May, 2012.

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#### **BY-LAW NO. 2012-125**

#### BEING A BY-LAW TO ADOPT OPTIONAL TOOLS FOR 2012 FOR THE PURPOSES OF ADMINISTERING LIMITS FOR THE COMMERCIAL, INDUSTRIAL AND MULTI-RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY CLASSES TAX CAPPING PROGRAM

WHEREAS The Corporation of the City of North Bay (hereinafter referred to as "The Municipality") may, in accordance with section 329.1 of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.0. 2001 c.25, as amended (hereinafter referred to as "The Act"), and Ontario Regulation 73/03, as made and amended under The Act, modify the provisions and limits set out in Part IX The Act, with respect to the calculation of taxes for municipal and school purposes for properties in the commercial, industrial and multi-residential property classes;

**AND WHEREAS** this by-law shall only apply to properties in any of the Commercial, Industrial and Multi-Residential property classes to which Part IX of *The Act* applies;

**AND WHEREAS** for the purposes of this by-law the commercial classes shall be considered a single property class and the industrial classes shall be deemed to be a single property class;

**AND WHEREAS** "uncapped taxes" means, the taxes for municipal and school purposes that would be levied for the taxation year but for the application of Part IX of *The Act*.

**AND WHEREAS** "capped taxes" means, the taxes for municipal and school purposes that shall be levied for the taxation year as a result of the application of Part IX of *The Act*.

**AND WHEREAS** Council may pass a by-law to apply any one or any combination of the following options:

- a. Increase the annual cap from 5% of last year's capped taxes up to a maximum of 10% of last year's capped taxes; and/or
- b. Set an upper limit on annual increases at the greater of the amount calculated under (a) and up to 5% of the previous year's annualized CVA tax; and/or
- c. Establish a capping adjustment threshold of up to \$250 for increasing properties, decreasing properties or both, whereby no capping adjustments less than the threshold amount would be applied; and/or
- d. Exempt properties from the capping calculation where the previous year's capped taxes for the property were equal to the uncapped taxes for that year; and/or
- e. Exempt properties from the capping calculation where the previous year's capped taxes were less than the previous year's CVA taxes, and the current year's capped taxes would otherwise be greater than the current year's CVA taxes, or vise-versa.

**AND WHEREAS** a by-law passed to adopt the provisions of subsection 329.1 paragraphs 1 and 2 of the Act provides that such provisions shall also apply to section 332 of *The Act* with respect to the "tenant cap" calculations;

**AND WHEREAS** Council has reviewed the provisions of Section 329.1 of *The Act* and the provisions of Ontario Regulation 73/03, and hereby deems it necessary and appropriate to adopt optional tools for the purpose of administering limits for the Commercial, Industrial and Multi-Residential property classes:

**AND WHEREAS** Council authorized the by-law to adopt optional tools for the purposes of administering limits for the Commercial, Industrial and Multi-Residential property classes for the year 2012 by Resolution No. 2012-\_\_\_\_ passed on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of May, 2012:

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of The Corporation of the City of North Bay hereby enacts as follows:

1. **THAT** paragraphs 1, 2 and 3, of Subsection 329.1 (1) of *The Act* shall apply to the Commercial, Industrial and Multi-Residential property classes for 2011.

#### 2. AND THAT

- (i) In determining the amount of taxes for municipal and school purposes for the year under subsection 329 (1) and the amount of the tenant's cap under subsection 332 (5), the greater of the amounts determined under paragraphs a) and b) as set out below shall apply in determining the amount to be added under paragraph 2 of subsection 329 (1), and the increasing amount under paragraph 2 of subsection 332 (5),
  - (a) The percentage set out in Subsection 329(1) paragraph 2 and in Subsection 332(5) paragraph 2 shall be ten per cent (10%), and
  - (b) The amount of the uncapped taxes for the previous year multiplied by five per cent (5%).
- (ii) The amount of the taxes for municipal and school purposes for a property for a taxation year shall be the amount of the uncapped taxes for the property for the year if the amount of the uncapped taxes exceeds the amount of the taxes for municipal and school purposes for the property for the taxation year as determined under section 329, as modified under section 329.1 of *The Act* and this by-law, by two-hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) or less.
- AND THAT paragraphs 1, 2 and 3, of Subsection 8.0.2 (2) of Ontario Regulation 73/03 shall apply to the Commercial, Industrial and Multi-Residential property classes for 2011.
- 4. **AND THAT** properties that meet any of the following conditions shall be exempt from the capping calculations set out under Part IX of *The Act* for the 2011 taxation year:
  - (i) The capped taxes for the property in the previous year were equal to its uncapped taxes for that year.
  - (ii) The capped taxes for the property in the previous year were lower than the property's uncapped taxes for that year, and the current year's capped taxes would be higher than the current year's uncapped taxes if Part IX were applied.
  - (iii) The capped taxes for the property in the previous year were higher than the property's uncapped taxes for that year, and the current year's capped taxes would be lower than the current year's uncapped taxes if Part IX were applied.
- 5. This by-law shall come into force and effect upon being passed.

WHEREAS The Corporation of the City of North Bay (hereinafter referred to as "The Municipality") may, in accordance with section 329.1 of the *Municipal Act, 2001,* S.0. 2001 c.25, as amended (hereinafter referred to as "The Act") modify the provisions and limits set out in section 331 of the Act, with respect to the calculation of taxes for municipal and school purposes payable in respect of property in the Commercial, Industrial and Multi-Residential property classes;

**AND WHEREAS** Council may pass a by-law to adopt the provisions of Section 329.1 of *The Act* whereby a "floor" or minimum uncapped tax percentage applies to eligible properties in one or more of the uncapped classes;

**AND WHEREAS** this by-law shall only apply to properties in the Commercial, Industrial and Multi-Residential property classes to which Part IX of *The Act* applies;

**AND WHEREAS** in this by-law, "uncapped taxes" means the taxes for municipal and school purposes that would be levied for the taxation year but for the application of Part IX of *The Act*;

**AND WHEREAS** Council has reviewed the provisions of Section 329.1 of the *Act* and hereby deems it necessary and appropriate to adopt optional tools for the purpose of providing minimum amounts for properties subject to the provisions of Section 331 for the Commercial, Industrial and Multi-Residential property classes;

**AND WHEREAS** Council authorized the by-law to apply a "floor" or minimum uncapped tax percentage to eligible properties in one or more of the uncapped classes for the year 2012 by Resolution No. 2012- passed on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of May. 2012:

# NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That paragraph 8 of Subsection 329.1 (1) of the *Act* shall apply to the Commercial, Industrial and Multi-Residential property classes in the City of North Bay for 2012.
- 2. That for all properties in the City of North Bay that become eligible within the meaning of subsection 331 (20) of the *Act*, the taxes for municipal and school purposes for the year or portion of the year shall be the greater of,
  - (i) The amount of the taxes determined for the property for 2012 under subsection 331 (2), and
  - (ii) The amount of the uncapped taxes for the property for 2012 multiplied by one hundred per cent (100%).
- 3. That this by-law shall come into force and take effect upon being passed.

**AND WHEREAS** this by-law shall only apply to properties in a property class to which Part IX of the *Act* applies;

**AND WHEREAS** for the purposes of this by-law the commercial classes shall be considered a single property class and the industrial classes shall be deemed to be a single property class;

AND WHEREAS limits to tax decreases for any class may only be established in order to recover all or part of the foregone revenue in respect of the same property class:

**AND WHEREAS** Council authorized the by-law to establish decrease limits for certain property classes by Resolution No. 2012-\_\_\_\_passed on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of May 2012;

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of The Corporation of the City of North Bay hereby enacts as follows:

 That pursuant to Section 330 of the Municipal Act, for the taxation year 2011, tax decreases for property in the following classes shall be subject to the following limitations:

Property Class	Percent Decrease Retained	Percent Decrease Claw back
The multi-residential property class	100%	0
The commercial property class	91.1745%	8.8255%
The industrial property class	100%	0

#### Where:

- a) Percent Decreased Retained means the proportion of an anticipated assessment related tax decrease that is passed through in accordance with Part IX of the Act, and
- b) Where Percent Decrease Clawback means the proportion of an anticipated assessment related tax decrease that is withheld in accordance with Part IX of the Act.
- 2. That this by-law shall come into force and take effect upon being passed.
