BY-LAW NUMBER 730.

A By-Law to provide for taking the votes of the electors on a proposed By-Law entitled "Being a By-Law for entering into a contract with North Bay Agricultural Association, for the purchase of certain lands and premises in the Town of North Bay for Park and Market purposes, and for borrowing the sum of Eleven Thousand, Eight Hundred and Thirty Dollars and ninety-three cents (\$11,830.93) for payment thereof".

WHEREAS a proposed By-Law of the Corporation of the Town of North Bay entitled, "Being a By-Law for entering into a contract with North Bay Agricultural Association, for the purchase of certain lands and premises in the Town of North Bay for Park and Market purposes, and for borrowing the sum of Eleven Thousand, Eight Hundred and Thirty Dollars and Ninety Three Cents (\$11,830.93) for payment thereof", requires for its validity the assent of the electors, and it is expedient and necessary to pass this By-Law for the purpose of enabling the electors to vote on the proposed By-Law.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF NORTH BAY, AS FOLLOWS: -

- The votes of the electors of the Corporation of the Town of North Bay shall be taken upon the said proposed By-Law at the same time and at the same places as the annual election for the Municipal Council, and the Deputy Returning officers appointed to hold said election shall take the vote.
- 2. On the 29th day of December, A. D. 1924, at the hour of two o'clock in the afternoon, the head of the Council of the said Corporation or some member of said Council appointed for the purpose by resolution shall attend at the Town Hall, in the said Municipality, for the purpose of appointing, and, if requested so to do, shall appoint by writing signed by him, two persons to attend at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk, and one person to attend at each polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and promoting the proposed By-Law, and a like number on behalf of the persons interested in and a like number of the persons interested in and a like number of By-Law, opposing the proposed By-Law.
- 3. On the 6th day of January, A. D. 1925, at the hour of 10.00 o'clock in the forenoon, at the Town Hall, in the said Municipality, the Clerk of the said Municipality, shall attend and sum up the votes given for and against the proposed By-Law.
