BY-LAW NO. 2007-35

BEING A BY-LAW TO AUTHORIZE THE UPGRADE OF TRANSIT FARE BOXES

WHEREAS the *Municipal Act*, 2001 (S.O. 2001, c-25), Section 326 authorizes the Council to pass a by-law for the purposes therein stated;

AND WHEREAS the *Municipal Act*, 2001 (S.O. 2001, c-25), Section 401 authorizes the Council to pass a by-law for the purposes herein stated;

AND WHEREAS the Council passed Resolution 2007-109 at its Meeting held on the 19th day of February, 2007, authorizing the upgrade of transit fare boxes, being 2007 Capital Budget Project No. 81, with a net debenture cost of \$320,000.00;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the expenditure of \$320,000.00 for the upgrade of the existing transit fare boxes for the following be hereby authorized:

Upgrade transit fare boxes \$ 302,000.00
Financing Costs 18,000.00

Net Amount to be Debentured \$ 320,000.00

- 2. That the Treasurer of the City of North Bay is hereby authorized to borrow from time to time from any bank or person by way of promissory note or notes temporary advances of money to meet the cost of work as aforesaid pending the completion thereof and pending the issue and sale of the debentures hereinafter referred to but in no event shall the aggregate of such borrowings exceed the amount of \$320,000.00 limited in this by-law.
- 3. Any promissory note or notes issued pursuant to paragraph 2 hereof shall be sealed with the seal of The Corporation of the City of North Bay and signed by the Mayor or Deputy Mayor and the Treasurer of the City of North Bay.
- 4. That the debentures to be issued to pay for the cost of such work shall bear interest at such rate as the Council may determine and shall be made payable within fifteen (15) years.
