

BY-LAW NO. 1558...

BEING a By-Law of the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay to provide for the submission of a certain question for the assent of the qualified Electors of the City of North Bay and to appoint a day on which to take a vote thereon and to name the places where votes are to be taken, and to appoint Deputy Returning Officers to take the vote at every such place.

WHEREAS the said Council deems it advisable to submit to the vote of the Electors of the Corporation, the following question:

- (a) Are you in favour of granting the Canadian Legion Branch 23, North Bay, an amount of money to the equal of the Annual Municipal Taxes on the Legion Memorial Hall, First Ave. West, North Bay, starting with the year 1950 and for each year thereafter.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. That there shall be submitted to the electors of the City of North Bay, the following question:
 - (a) Are you in favour of granting the Canadian Legion Branch 23, North Bay, an amount of money to the equal of the Annual Municipal Taxes on the Legion Memorial Hall, First Ave. West, North Bay, starting with the year 1950 and for each year thereafter?
2. That the votes of the said electors shall be taken on the said question at the same time and places and by the Deputy Returning Officers and Poll Clerks, as the annual Municipal Elections.
3. A true copy of question shall be published in the North Bay Nugget on the tenth, seventeenth, and twenty-fourth days of November, 1949.
4. On the thirtieth day of November, 1949, at his office in the City Hall, on Ferguson Street, in the City of North Bay at (2) two o'clock in the afternoon, the Mayor, if requested so to do, will in writing, signed by him, appoint two persons to attend the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk of the Corporation and one person to attend each Polling Place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of voting in the affirmative on the said question and a like number on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of voting in the negative on the said question.
5. The fourteenth day of December, at the said Council Chambers, at (12) twelve o'clock in the forenoon, is hereby appointed as the time and place for summing up by the Clerk of this Corporation of the number of votes given in the affirmative and in the negative, respectively.
