WHEREAS, in incorporating North Bay Hydro Distribution Limited, the Council of the Corporation of the City of North Bay determined that North Bay Hydro Distribution Limited should operate on a sustaining profit model under which there is a sufficient return to maintain the value of the utility assets and the viability of the utility, but without requiring any shareholder dividend for the Corp-oration of the City of North Bay;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the City of North Bay hereby resolves as follows:

- 1. The Corporation of the City of North Bay hereby affirms that North Bay Hydro Distribution Limited should continue to be incorporated as provided in subsection 142(1).
- 2. The Corporation of the City of North Bay hereby further affirms that North Bay Hydro Distribution Limited should operate under a sustaining profit model where,
 - a) there is a sufficient return to maintain the value of the utility's assets and the viability of the corporation as a utility;
 - b) the City will not require any shareholder dividend; and
 - c) any operating surplus is sufficient to recover the depreciation of assets and to pay any taxes that may be assessed, and any balance thereof is applied to distribution purposes only.
- 3. The Mayor and Clerk shall provide to the Minister of Energy of the Province of Ontario on or before March 7, 2003, a certificate certifying the passing of this resolution in the form provided for in Ontario Regulation 430/02.
