## BY-LAW NO. 1728.

BEING A BY-LAW to provide for the Licensing, regulating and governing the operation of Ambulances in the City of North Bay.

WHEREAS the Municipal Council of the City of North Bay have been requested to pass a By-law to regulate and License ambulances in the City of North Bay.

THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. No person, firm or corporation shall operate an ambulance in the City of North Bay, until a license so to do shall have been obtained. Said license to be known as Ambulance License.
- 2. The said license shall be for the current year at the time of issue and shall expire on the 31st day of December next succeeding the date of same.
- 3. No license issued hereunder shall be transferrable without the consent of the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay.
- 4. The yearly fee for the said Ambulance License shall be Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), and shall be paid on the date of the application.
- 5. Application for license under this By-law shall be made at the City Manager's Office.
- 6. Any person convicted of a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall forfeit and pay at the discretion of the convicting Magistrate a penalty not exceeding the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) exclusive of costs of each offence, and in default of payment of said penalty and costs forthwith said penalty and costs, or costs only, may be levied by distress and sale of goods and titles of the offender and in case of there being no distress found out of which such penalty can be levied the Convicting Magistrate may commit the offender to the common jail with or without hard labour for any period not exceeding 21 days. Unless the penalty and costs, if any, including the cost of the said distress and the commital and conveyance of the offender to the said jail are sooner paid.
