BEING A BY-LAW of the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay to close all the lanes in the block bounded on the north by McLaren Street on the south by Bourke Street bounded on the west by Durrell Street and bounded on the east by Harvey Street according as said block and lanes are shown on two plans of sub-division of the City of North Bay prepared by L. O. Clarke, Esq., O.L.S. and registered in the Registry Office for the Registry Division of the District of Nipissing on the 20th day of November, 1906 and on the 5th day of March 1910.

WHEREAS the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the City of North Bay have been requested and upon consideration, deem it advisable to close all the lanes in the block bounded on the north by McLaren Street, bounded on the south by Bourke Street, bounded on the west by Durrell Street, and bounded on the east by Harvey Street according as said block and lanes are shown on two plans of sub-division of the City of North Bay prepared by L. O. Clarke, Esq., O.L.S. and registered in the Registry Office for the Registry Division of the District of Nipissing on the 20th day of November, 1906 and on the 5th day of March, 1910.

THEREFORE under and by virtue of the authority vested in the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay by the Municipal Act, being R.S.O. 1927, Chapter 233, THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:/-

1. That the two lanes running from McLaren Street to Bourke Street between Bourke Street and Harvey Street be and the same are hereby closed and stopped up. That the lane in the said block being abutted by lots 30 to 37 inclusive on Bourke Street be and the same is hereby closed and stopped up.

2. That forthwith upon this By-Law taking effect the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay shall convey the said lanes as closed and stopped up under the next preceding section to the registered owners of the lands abutting thereon for the consideration of the sum of \$80.20.

3. That the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay shall hear in person or by his or her Solicitor, Counsel or agent, any person who claims that his or her lands will be prejudicially affected by this By-Law, and who applies to be heard.

4. That this By-Law shall take effect upon the passing thereof and after notice of the same has been published once a week for four consecutive weeks as provided by the Statutes in that behalf.

Read a First time in Open Council this 18th day of June, 1934. Read a Second time in Open Council this 16th day of July, 1934. Rules of Order were suspended and By-Law was read a Third time short and passed this 16th day of July, 1934.
