<u>Res. #2017-242(a)</u>: Moved by Councillor Vrebosch, seconded by Councillor Mayne That Council approve the following amendments to the On-Street Parking By-Law No. 2014-37, as recommended in Report to Council EESW-2017-007 dated May 17, 2017:

- Amend the definition of "Winter Months" in s. 2.1 to be Winter Months mean the period between November 1st and April 15th inclusive of each year. The definition currently reads as follows: "Winter Months means the period between November 1st and March 31st inclusive of each year."
- 2) Change Section 3.3 Parking Winter Months to state:

Commencing November 1st and ending April 15th inclusive of each year;

(a) No person shall park a vehicle on any street section where there is a cul-de-sac or dead-end between 3:00am to 8:30am; and

(b) No person shall park a vehicle on any other street between 3:00am to 7:30am.

- 1) Add the definition of the "Downtown Improvement Area (DIA)" to s. 2.1 and include a map as Schedule 11.
- 2) Change Section 3.3 Parking Winter Months to state:

Commencing November 1st and ending April 15th inclusive of each year;

(a) No person shall park a vehicle on any street within the Downtown Improvement Area (DIA) boundaries between 3:00am to 6:30am.

And Whereas natural gas access can provide residents on higheremitting fuels with a lower carbon energy source that will help reduce greenhouse gas emissions;

Therefore Be It Resolved that the Council of the City of North Bay formally support an application submitted by a natural gas distributor or supplier to the Government of Ontario, for a grant from provincial Natural Gas Grant Program, to expand the natural gas system in the Peninsula Road area;

And Further That Council supports making a financial contribution towards the proposed project in an amount equivalent to the property tax that would be recovered on the new natural gas infrastructure for a period of ten (10) years as per the natural gas grant program requirements;

And Further That a copy of this resolution be forwarded along with the application to Ontario's Natural Gas Grant Program.
