

BY-LAW NO. 1267

BEING A BY-LAW to provide for the licensing and regulation of the use of private homes, boarding houses, tourists camps and other such establishments providing sleeping accommodation for tourists.

WHEREAS the Municipality of the City of North Bay deems it advisable to pass a By-Law regulating and licensing the use of private homes, boarding houses, tourist camps and other such establishments within the said municipality providing sleeping accommodation for tourists.

THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. It shall not be lawful for any person to make use of a private home, boarding house, tourist camp or other such establishment providing sleeping accommodation for tourists without having first obtained a license therefore.
2. Every person operating tourist cabins shall pay a fee of \$2.00 for each cabin and all homes catering to tourists shall pay a fee of \$2.00 for the first room and \$1.00 for each additional room.
3. No license shall be issued to any person under the provisions of this By-Law unless such person has received a certificate from the Sanitary Inspector of the said Municipality certifying as to the suitability of the premises in question for such purpose.
4. Every person receiving a license under the provisions of this By-Law shall keep a register which shall be signed by all guests and which shall be available for police inspection at all reasonable times.
5. Every person receiving a license under the provision of this By-Law shall cause such license to be displayed in a prominent place within such building or on such premises.
6. "Person" in this By-Law includes any body corporate or politic, partnership or the heirs or executors, administrators or other legal representative of the person to whom the context can apply according to law.

7. All licenses given under this By-Law shall run from the first day of January and expire on the last day of December, and all such licenses, unless they are expressed to be for a shorter period, or unless the same become sooner forfeited or revoked shall be for the year current at the date thereon and shall expire on the 31st. day of December next following the date of same.

8. Any person offending against the provision of this By-Law shall, upon conviction thereof before any Justice of the Peace or Police Magistrate forfeit and pay at the discretion of the convicting Magistrate a penalty not exceeding (exclusive of costs), the sum of TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00) for each offence, and in default of payment of the said penalty and costs forthwith, the said penalty and costs, or costs only, may be levied by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the offender, and in case of there being no distress found out of which such penalty and costs or costs only, can be levied, the convicting Magistrate may commit the offender to the common gaol of the District of Nipissing, with or without hard labour for any period not exceeding 10 days, unless the said penalty and costs or costs only including the costs of the said distress and of the committal and conveyance of the offender to the said gaol are sooner paid.

9. This By-Law shall come into force and take effect on and after the passing thereof.
