

BY-LAW NO. 1249

BEING A BY-LAW to fix the Polling Places and appoint Deputy Returning Officers for the holding of Municipal Elections for the year 1937, in the Municipality of North Bay.

WHEREAS it is necessary to pass a By-Law fixing Polling Places and appointing Deputy Returning Officers for the purpose of taking the vote of the Electors, to select a Mayor and Ten (10) Aldermen (to be elected by general vote) to transact the Municipal affairs of the City, and for the selection of Public School Trustees (One (1) for each Ward for Two year Term (1937-1938, and One Public School Trustee for Ward No. 4 for One Year Term.(1937).

THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- (1) THAT Polling Place No. 1 for the purpose of the said election shall be in W. Santary's Store, 382 Main Street West, and A. Whittingham and W. Frizzell are hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officers.
- (2) THAT Polling Place No. 2 for the purpose of the said election shall be in the Court House, Bye and McIntyre Streets, and Gordon Darling and R. J. Peel are hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officers.
- (3) THAT Polling Place No. 3 for the purpose of the said election shall be in Mrs. Faught's residence, 16 Front Street, and Maurice Hicks and C. J. O'Grady are hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officers.
- (4) THAT Polling Place No. 4 for the purpose of the said election shall be in H. T. Relph's residence, 145 Worthington Street West, and H. Freeman and D. J. Quinn are hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officers.
- (5) THAT Polling Place No. 5 for the purpose of the said election shall be in the City Hall, McIntyre and Ferguson Streets, and E. J. Carter is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer.
- (6) THAT Polling Place No. 6 for the purpose of the said election shall be in the Canadian Legion Club Rooms, McIntyre and Ferguson Streets, and S. G. Stewart and H. St. Germain are hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officers.
- (7) THAT Polling Place No. 7 for the purpose of the said election shall be in the Orange Hall, Fisher and McIntyre Streets, and E. B. Willis and L. Thacker are hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officers.
- (8) THAT Polling Place No. 8 for the purpose of the said election shall be in the Orange Hall, Fisher and McIntyre Streets, and G. H. Newton and H. R. Miller are hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officers.
- (9) THAT Polling Place No. 9 for the purpose of the said election shall be in Mr. C. Washburn's residence, 336 Main Street East and J. M. White and W. Foster are hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officers.
- (10) THAT Polling Place No. 10 for the purpose of the said election shall be in Mr. S. J. Whittingham's residence, 209 Fisher Street and W. Brady, H. Robinson and Forrest Allen are hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officers.
- (11) THAT Polling Place No. 11 for the purpose of the said election shall be in Mr. Wellington Irvine's residence, 212 Cassell Street, and P. W. White, T. H. Winters and D. J. McKeown are hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officers.

(12) THAT Polling Place No. 12 for the purpose of the said election shall be in T. H. Clark's residence, 139 Front Street, and A. S. Waite and S. J. Chamberlain are hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officers.

(13) THAT Polling Place No. 13 for the purpose of the said election shall be in E. C. Bebee's residence, 399 Cassells Street and C. J. Corbett and E. J. Barber are hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officers.

(14) THAT the Railway Employees, Express Messengers and Commercial Travellers Advance Polling Place for the purpose of the said election shall be in the City Hall, Ferguson and McIntyre Streets and E. A. Rutledge is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer.

(15) THAT the City Clerk shall attend the Council Chambers at the hour of Twelve Noon on the 8th. day of December, A.D.1936 for the final summing up of the number of votes for the Mayor and Aldermen.

READ a Second Time in Open Council this 2nd. day of November, 1936.
