BY-LAW NO. 1368

BEING a By-Law regulating the closing of stores under the classification of Barber Shops and Hairdressing Parlours.

WHEREAS a Petition duly signed under the provisions of Section 82, Subsection 4 of the Factory, Shop and Office Building Act, being R.S.O. 1937, Chapter 194, has been presented to the MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY praying that By-Law be passed amending By-Law No. 1161 and all amendments thereto in as far as they effect the businesses classified as Barber Shops and Hairdressing Parlours.

AND WHEREAS it is deemed advisable to amend By-Law No. 1161 and all Amendments thereto in accordance with the Petition as presented.

THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That all Barber Shops and Hairdressing Parlours within the limits of the City of North Bay of the following classifications namely, Barber Shops and Hairdressing Parlours shall be closed at the hour of seven o'clock in the afternoon of each day in each week of the year excepting Wednesdays and the said Shops shall remain closed from the said hour of seven o'clock in the afternoon until five o'clock on the following morning.
- 2. The provisions of By-Law No. 1161 and all amendments thereto inconsistent with the Provisions of this By-Law are hereby repealed.
- 3. Nothing in this By-Law shall be construed as amending or in any way altering By-Law No. 1161 of the said City of North Bay with regard to Wednesday closing.

THIS BY-LAW shall come into force and take effect on the 12th. day of May 1942.
