

BY-LAW NUMBER 918.

BEING a By-law to amend By-Law Number 917 being a By-law with reference to conveyance of jail site to the Government of the Province of Ontario.

WHEREAS it is deemed advisable to amend By-law Number 917 in a certain particular.

NOW THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY DOES HEREBY ENACT:

1. Section Three of By-law 917 shall have added to it the following clause:- The Municipality of the City of North Bay will also provide for the free disposal of any sewerage through any disposal works that may hereafter be constructed.


2. Save as above provided said By-law Number 917 remains in full force and effect.



With reference to your verbal request concerning rates to be charged to the proposed North Bay jail, the Commission are pleased to advise that service will be given at the rates prevailing in the City of North Bay but are unable to guarantee that the service will continue indefinitely as in the event of a Rural Power District being established and a rural line passing in front of the jail property, rural rates would necessarily be charged in fairness to other consumers served from the Rural Power District system.
