

BY-LAW NO. 1669

BEING A BY-LAW to provide for the submission of certain questions for the assent of the qualified tax payers of the City of North Bay and to appoint a day on which to take a vote thereon and to name the places where votes are to be taken and to appoint Deputy Returning Officers to take the votes at each such place.

WHEREAS the said Council deems it advisable to submit to the vote of the electors of the Corporation the following question:-

Are you in favour of establishing a Parks Commission to further the beautification of the City, and that such Commission be financed to the extent of not more than one mill annually on the total assessment of the municipality at large?

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. That there shall be submitted to the qualified taxpayers of the City of North Bay the following question:-

Are you in favour of establishing a Parks Commission to further the beautification of the City, and that such Commission be financed to the extent of not more than one mill annually on the total assessment of the municipality at large?

2. That the vote of the said qualified tax payers shall be taken on the said question at the same time and places and by the Deputy Returning Officers and Poll Clerks as the Annual Municipal Elections.

3. That a true copy of the question shall be published in the North Bay Daily Nugget on the days hereinafter mentioned, that is to say on the 5th, 12th and 19th days of November 1952.

4. On the 26th day of November 1952 at his office in the Council Chambers on Ferguson Street in the City of North Bay at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, the Mayor will, in writing signed by him, appoint two persons to attend the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk of this Corporation, and one person to attend each polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of promoting the proposed question, and a like number on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of opposing the question.

5. The 10th day of December 1952 in the said Council Chambers at 12 o'clock noon is hereby appointed as the time and place for the summing up by the Clerk of this Corporation of the number of votes given in the affirmative and in the negative respectively.
