#### BY-LAW NO. 2370

THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY

Being a By-law authorizing the replacement of certain sidewalks in the City of North Bay at the expense of The Corporation of the City of North Bay.

WHEREAS the sidewalks more particularly specified and described in Schedule "A" to this By-law need to be replaced;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- For the purposes of this By-law:
  - (a) "City" shall mean The Corporation of the City of North Bav.

  - (b) "Council" shall mean the Council of The Corporation of the City of North Bay.(c) "Engineer" shall mean the Engineer for the time being of The Corporation of the City of North Bay.
- That the sidewalks more particularly specified and described in Schedule "A" to this By-law (and which said Schedule "A" shall be deemed to be incorporated in and form a part of this By-law) shall be replaced at the expense of the City pursuant to the provisions of The Local Improvement Act R.S.O. 1960 Chapter 223 Section 59(1).
- 3. That the Engineer do forthwith make all necessary plans, profiles and specifications and furnish such information as may be necessary for the entering into of a contract for the execution of the said work.
- 4. That the said work shall be carried out and executed under the superintendence of and according to the directions and orders of the Engineer.
- 5. The Mayor and Clerk of the City are hereby authorized, on behalf of the City, to enter into a contract for the performance of the said work subject to the approval of Council to be declared by Resolution.
- 6. That the Mayor or Deputy Mayor and the Treasurer of the City of North Bay are hereby authorized to borrow from time to time from any bank or person by way of promissory note or notes temporary advances of money to meet the cost of construction as aforesaid pending the completion thereof and pending the issue and sale of the debentures hereinafter referred to but in no event shall the aggregate of such borrowings exceed the amount limited in this By-law.
- 7. That the cost of the said work be borne by the City and that a By-law be enacted for the issue of debentures to cover the cost of the said work.
- 8. That the debentures to be issued to pay for the cost of such work shall bear interest at such rate as the Council may determine and shall be made payable within ten years on the instalment plan.
- This By-law shall not become effective until approval in writing has been secured from the Ontario Municipal Board pursuant to Section 64(1) of The Ontario Municipal Board Act R.S.O. 1960 Chapter 274,



#### REPORT TO THE BOARD

Under an authority granted pursuant to Section 15 of <u>The</u>

Ontario Municipal Board Act, I attended at the Juvenile and Family

Court Building in North Bay and conducted a public hearing of this application on August 9, 1967, with respect to those items which had not been approved previously. The items not yet approved are as follows:

- ✓Item 2 asphalt pavement on Duke Street from Cassells

  Street to a line between Lots 484 and 485 at a

  cost of \$10,427.84.
- / Item 5 asphalt pavement with concrete curbs and gutters on Aubrey Street from Cassells Street to High Street at a cost of \$18,805.60.
  - Item 6 asphalt pavement with concrete curbs and gutters on Hammond Street from Third Avenue to Haig Street at a cost of \$\pi 20,099.75.

Only one objection to the work described in Item 2 was voiced at the hearing, and this was more in the nature of a request for

information as to the reasons why the estimated cost per foot was higher than the estimated cost for the works proposed in Items 5 and 6 although the latter included curbs and gutters. The explanation given by the city engineer is that rock conditions on Duke Street will cause the extra costs. No objection was voiced at the hearing to the work described in Item 5.

Objection and support from owners of abutting properties to the work proposed for Hammond Street was about evenly divided. This street was paved previously but deteriorated considerably as a result of being used as a detour route when Fisher Street was When the city indicated it would rebuilt three years ago. resurface the street, some residents indicated a desire for curbs and gutters on the north side to alleviate flooding conditions which are said to occur on the lots on that side after heavy rain because the land slopes in that direction. This resulted in a plan to widen the road to 28 feet with curbs and gutters but this was abandoned when other residents expressed a desire for a paved width of 32 feet with curbs and gutters. It is this latter proposal which is embodied in this application.

There are also objections to the cost. The policy of the city, expressed in By-law 2278, for the original paving of a residential street is to charge abutting properties for the cost to a width of 24 feet only and the city bears the cost of any width in excess of 24 feet as well as the costs of curbs and gutters and storm sewers. That by-law does not apply here as this is not an original paving. Instead, the city proposes to bear the cost for repaving up to the width of 24 feet and to charge all additional costs to the abutting properties on the grounds that resurfacing would not require reconstruction whereas a width of 32 feet would require complete rebuilding. According to the evidence of the city engineer, curbs and gutters and a width in excess of 24 feet are not necessary on this street.

It should be noted that the work proposed for Hammond Street is not on petition and it does not appear from the evidence that those seeking the greater width represent a majority of those who would be charged. The lack of necessity precludes, in my opinion, the imposition of a special charge on a dissident majority to meet the desires of a minority. For this reason alone, in my opinion, approval should be refused. The city was not represented by legal counsel and it is not clear whether any consideration was given to Section 26 of The Local Improvement Act which seems to suggest that in the case of the widening of a pavement undertaken without petition the whole of the cost of construction or reconstruction for the width in excess of the existing width is to be added to the municipality's share for the construction or reconstruction to the existing width.

In summary, I recommend that Items 2 and 5 be approved and that approval of Item 6 be refused.




