TO THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY

Your Worship and Councillors:

The Community Services Committee presents Report No. 2003-13 and recommends:

- That a) the application from the Near North District School Board to rezone the subject property on First Avenue East from a "Residential Multiple First Density (RM1)" zone to a "Residential Multiple Fourth Density Special Zone No. 88 (RM4 Sp. 88)" be approved; and
 - b) the subject property be placed under Site Plan Control pursuant to Section 41 of the *Planning Act*, R.S.O. 1990, in order to regulate lighting, parking, access including access through the adjacent City owned parking lot (Option 2 of the

Planning Advisory Committee Report May 28, 2003), traffic, fencing, architectural/streetscape design guidelines, landscaping, lot grading, servicing, garbage storage and storm water management.

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- 2. That a) the Condominium application by Russell Colvin on behalf of Taki's Investments Inc. on the property described as Conc. "C", Lot 17, Parcels 3326, 6297, 3156, 3223, 3222, 17154 including Reference Plan 36R-4724, Parts 1 to 5, Reference Plan 36R-4871, Remainder of Part 1 (2672 Trout Lake Road) to create a Plan of Condominium as represented on Draft Plan of Condominium prepared by Goodridge Walker Limited dated May 27, 2003 and as shown as Schedule "B" to the Technical Report dated June 23, 2003, be given Draft Approval subject to the conditions contained in Appendix "A" to the Technical Report dated June 23, 2003; and
 - b) the subject property be placed under Site Plan Control pursuant to Section 41, of the *Planning Act,* R.S.O. 1990, as amended to address lighting, parking, traffic, access, stormwater management, lot grading, servicing and landscaping.

WHEREAS the catchment area for the North Bay General Hospital extends 500 km north to south, covering an area of 30,717 sq. km with a total population of 129,121.

WHEREAS there are 29 municipalities in the catchment area with no upper-tier level of government to co-ordinate funding or long-term financing.

WHEREAS the targeted municipal share for the project is \$24.4 Million.

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WHEREAS surveys have determined that the targeted municipal share for this project represents a much larger burden per capita than other hospital projects.

WHEREAS municipalities in Northeastern Ontario have experienced declining population, a declining assessment base, lower income per capita which reduce their ability to absorb the burden.

WHEREAS the Province has created the Ontario Municipal Economic Infrastructure Financing Authority and the object of the "Authority" is "to provide financing for municipalities and other such public bodies as may be specified by regulation for such purposes as may be specified by regulation".

WHEREAS the City of North Bay will have to contribute up to \$7.16 million towards bringing services to the proposed new hospital site and has agreed to contribute up to \$1.5 million towards the proposed Children's Treatment Centre.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Province of Ontario be asked to provide additional funding for the North Bay Regional Health Centre Project and that the additional funding be applied to reduce the municipal share of the local target by at least \$6.6 million,
- 2. The Minister of Finance be asked to include "hospitals, or corporations established to fund hospital projects", as eligible public bodies, and "new hospital construction" as an eligible category for loans from the Ontario Municipal Economic Infrastructure Financing Authority (OMEIFA), and
- 3. The Ontario Municipal Economic Infrastructure Financing Authority allocate a low interest loan of up to \$24.4 million towards the North Bay Regional Health Centre Capital Project to be repaid by municipalities in the catchment area over a twenty year period.
- The City of North Bay agree to funding for the North Bay Regional Health Centre in the amount of \$11.9 million payable with interest over a twenty year period with estimated annual payments of approximately \$1.0 million per year, subject to successful securing of additional funding to reduce the municipal share by \$6.6 million.
- 5. That copies of this resolution be forwarded to the North Bay General Hospital, the North Bay Regional Hospital Health Centre, other hospitals in the catchment area, all municipalities in the catchment area, the Minister of Health and Long-Term Care, the Minister of Finance, the Minister of Northern Development and Mines, the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, Al McDonald MPP, and Bob Wood, MP.
