BEING A By-law for licensing and regulating all victualling houses, ordinaries, and houses where fruit, fish, oysters, clams or victuals are sold to be eaten therein, and places not being a tavern or shop licensed under the Liquor License Act for the lodging refreshment or entertainment of the public.

WHEREAS it is deemed advisable that a By-law should be passed for the purpose of licensing and regulating all victualling houses, ordinaries, and houses where fruit, fish, oysters, clams or victuals are sold to be eaten therein, and places not being a tavern or shop licensed under the Liquor License Act, for lodging, reception, refreshment or entertainment of the public.

THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:-

1. FROM and after the First day of May, 1926, no victualling houses, ordinaries, and houses where fruit, fish, oysters, clams and victuals are sold to be eaten therein, and places not being a tavern or shop licensed under the Liquor License Act for the lodging, reception refreshment or entertainment of the public, shall be maintained within the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay, without the owner or proprietor first having obtained a license.

2. The license amounting to One Dollar (\$1.00) per year and shall be payable on the First day of May, 1926 and on the first day of January in each and every year hereafter.

3. The Chief of Police and his men shall have the power to inspect all such houses and report their findings to the Council .

4. This By-law shall not apply to or include private boarding houses.

5. In the event of any owner or proprietor carrying on business as above stated without first having obtained a license, the said owner or proprietor may be summoned to appear before the Local Magistrate and shall incur a penalty of not less than One Dollar (\$1.00) for each and every infraction of this By-law together with costs. And in the event of the costs and the amount of the fine not being paid forthwith the said owner or proprietor may be incarcerated in the Common Gaol for the District of Nipissing for not longer than Thirty days.
