THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY

BY-LAW NO. 74-88

BEING A BY-LAW TO REGULATE OWNERS OF DOGS. (STOOP AND SCOOP)

WHEREAS Section 210 (6b) of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1980, c. 302, as amended by the Statutes of Ontario, 1987, chapter 10, provides that by-laws may be passed for requiring any person who owns or harbours a dog to remove excrement left by the dog anywhere in the municipality.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. In this By-law:-
 - (a) "Public Property" means any property in the City of North Bay owned by The Corporation of the City of North Bay, The Nipissing Board of Education or The Nipissing District Roman Catholic Separate School Board.
- 2. Any person who owns or harbours a dog shall remove forthwith excrement left by the dog upon any public property or private property in the City of North Bay except on private property with the consent of the owner of such property.
- 3. This by-law shall not apply to the owners of seeing-eye dogs registered with The Canadian National Institute for the Blind.
- 4. This by-law shall be enforced by the Pollution Control Officer, the officers and servants of the North Bay and District Humane Society, and by any police officer.
- 4. Any person who contravenes any provision of this by-law is guilty of an offence and subject to a fine of not more than \$500.00, exclusive of costs, which fine shall be recoverable under the Provincial Offences Act.
- 5. This by-law shall take effect upon being passed.
