

THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY

BY-LAW NO. 244-90

BEING A BY-LAW FOR THE PURPOSE OF UNDERTAKING FEASIBILITY STUDIES, RESEARCH AND OTHER ACTIONS AS ARE NECESSARY TO ESTABLISH A SYSTEM FOR THE DISPOSAL OF GARBAGE AND OTHER REFUSE.

WHEREAS the Council deems it necessary to do feasibility studies, research and other actions necessary to comply with the Environmental Assessment Act before approval of the Minister of the Environment is given to proceed with an undertaking.

AND WHEREAS the Council wishes to undertake such feasibility studies, research and other actions as are necessary to establish a system for the disposal of garbage and other refuse at the expense of all the rateable property in the municipality pursuant to Section 210(85) of the Municipal Act.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:


1. That feasibility studies, research and other actions as are necessary to establish a system for the disposal of garbage and other refuse be undertaken at an estimated cost of \$1,260,000.00 as set out in Schedule "A" attached hereto and forming part of this By-Law.
2. That the Treasurer of The Corporation of the City of North Bay is hereby authorized to borrow from time to time from any bank or person by way of promissory note or notes, temporary advances of money to meet the cost of the aforesaid expenditures pending the issue and sale of debentures hereinafter referred to, but in no event shall the aggregate of such borrowing exceed the amount limited in this By-Law.
3. Any promissory note or notes issued pursuant to Paragraph 2 hereof shall be sealed with the seal of The Corporation of the City of North Bay and signed by the Mayor or Deputy Mayor and the Treasurer of the City of North Bay.
4. The debentures to be issued when the work is completed to pay for the cost of such work shall bear interest at such rate as Council may determine and shall be made payable within 15 years on the instalment plan and shall be a charge against all rateable property in the City of North Bay.
5. This By-Law shall not become effective until approval has been received from the Ontario Municipal Board pursuant to the Ontario Municipal Board Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 3, Section 64(1).

READ A SECOND TIME IN OPEN COUNCIL THE 10TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1990.
