BY-LAW NUMBER 660

BEING a By-Law to provide for the Collection, Removal and Disposal of Ashes, Food Garbage and other refuse.

WHEREAS it is deemed advisable by the Municipal Council of the Town of North Bay, to pass a By-law regulating the collection, Removal and Disposal of Ashes, Food Garbage and other refuse within the limits of the said town, and to provide for the payment of service rendered by the Municipality in connection with the said work.

BE IT ENACTED AND IT IS THEREFORE HEREBY ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Town of North Bay as follows:-

- 1. That all former By-laws regulating the collection and disposal of garbage be and the same are hereby repealed.
- 2. That the collection, removal and disposal of ashes, food garbage and other refuse by performed under the supervision of the Sanitary Inspector and Town Engineer.
- 3. That no pit closets shall be used within the limits of the Town of North Bay.
- 4. That all closets must conform with the standard plan of closet hereby adopted by the Corporation of the Town of North Bay and hereto attached. That all existing pit closets must be remodelled to comply as nearly as possible with the said sketch and those closets which cannot be remodelled are to be replaced by new closets.
- 5. That all closets shall be constructed and maintained fly-proof.
- 6. That all closets must be equipped with the standard pail or bucket of the Corporation of the Town of North Bay.
 - (a) The standard shall have the following dimensions;

19 inches in diameter at top

14 " " bottom

18 " " height.

- 7. That all closets within the limits of the Town of North Bay must be kept clean and buckets emptied and cleaned twice a month or oftener if necessary, the cost of which service shall be borne by the Municipality at large and included in the general rate of taxation for each year.
- 8. It shall be the duty of the driver of every night soil wagon to thoroughly wash his wagon and disinfect it with Chloride of Lime or other disinfectant supplied by the Corporation, after every load has been dumped, between the first day of April and the First day of December in each year.
- If after one month's notice in writing from the Sanitary Inspector the occupant of any premises not located on a Public sewer has failed to provide standard buckets or pails as required by the Health Act, the same be supplied by this department and the cost thereof added to the Collector's Roll of Collection as part of the expense of cleaning and disposing of the contents of such privys, earth closets, privy faults or dry earth closets, and such occupant so failing shall also be liable to the penalty herein after provided.

- 10. When any dumb animal shall die within the limits of the Town, the owner shall at his own expense, within twelve hours thereafter cause the carcass to be removed to the place provided by the Municipality, and there disposed of as the Sanitary Inspector may direct.
- 11. That proper metal garbage cans and pails must be maintained by fruit dealers, Fish Dealers; Grocers, Butchers, Ice Cream Vendors, Candy Manufacturers, Confectioners, Boarding Houses, Hotels, Restaurants, and private houses, within the limits of the Town of North Bay for the purpose of depositing food garbage therein as it is created, and barrels for collection of tin cans and other refuse.
- That food garbage cans and barrels with other refuse must be emptied and cleaned subject to paragraph (13) the food garbage and refuse must be removed to the place provided by the Municipality three times a week by the owner at his own expense.
- That any party may contract with the Corporation Contractor of the Town of North Bay to collect, remove, and dispose of his or her food garbage and refuse at the rates and charges hereinafter set forth.
- That collection, removal and disposal of ashes and food garbage and other refuse shall be extended to private houses, who desire the service, under the same rules and regulations as applied to those parties under clause (12).
- That garbage may be collected by other persons than the Corporation Contractor, provided a permit is obtained from the Sanitary Inspector, and that a charge of One Dollar (\$1.00) for each permit be paid to the Municipality. Any such person will be required to take all garbage and refuse to the place provided by the Municipality, unless the garbage is for the feeding of hogs, by a person properly licensed for same.
- That the rates and charges to be charged and collected for the collection, removal and disposal of ashes, food garbage and other refuse, within the limits of the Town of North Bay, shall be those est forth in By-Law 619 hereto annexed or in any amending Schedule that may be hereinafter made by the Corporation.
- Any person committing a breach of this B-Law will be liable to a fine of not more than \$10. for the first offence and to not more than \$20. for each subsequent offence, together with costs of court. Any fine not paid forthwith, is to be collected if possible by distress of the goods and chattels of the party liable for payment of the said fine and costs, and in default of distress, the said party may be convicted to the common jail in the Town of North Bay for term of not more than ten days.
- This By-Law shall take effect immediately after the passing thereof.

That the Schedule of rates and charges for services rendered in collection, removal, and disposal of ashes, food garbage and other refuse under By-law No. 531 shall be as follows:-

- 1. Blocks not occupied by \$1.25 per Mo. removal 3 times per tenants for house- week keeping purposes.
- 2. " Occupied for house-\$1.25 " " " " " " keeping purposes by, & 50¢ extra per tenant. up to and not more than 4 tenants.
- 3. " Occupied for house- .50 per Mo.removal 3 times per keeping purposes by & 35¢ per extra tenant. week more than 4 tenats.
