#### BY-LAW NO. 1887

BEING A BY-LAW to authorize construction of SanitarySewers, Concrete Sidewalks and Asphalt Road Surfaces in the City of North Bay.

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the City of North Bay deem it advisable to provide for the construction of Sanitary Sewers, Concrete Sidewalks and Asphalt Road Surfaces in the said City.

THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY under the provisions of Section 8, Chapter 215, R.S.O. 1950, The Local Improvement Act: and Section 308 (2) Chapter 243, R.S.O. 1950, The Municipal Act, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:-

- That Sanitary Sewers, Concrete Sidewalks and Asphalt Road Surfaces be constructed on the streets described in Schedule "A" which schedule is attached hereto and forms part of this By-law.
- The Corporation's share of such work shall be that protion as specified in The Local Improvement Act, being Chapter 215 Section 23 A, B. & C, where applicable, and Section 28 (1) where in the case of corner lots and triangular or irregularly shaped lots situated at the junction or intersection of streets, a reduction of 1/3 of the cost shall be made, which protion shall be assumed as the Corporation's share.
- That the Corporation at large shall assume and pay for out of the general rate, the percentage of cost for concrete sidewalk replacements, as set out in By-law No. 1685 attached hereto as Schedule "B", which schedule forms part of this By-law.
- That the Engineering Department of the City be instructed to make all necessary plans, profiles and specifications forthwith, and to furnish such information as may be necessary for the making of a contract for the execution of the work, or for the carrying on of the work by day labour.
- That the work shall be carried on under the superintendance and according to the directions and orders of the Engineering Department of the City.
- The Council may decide by resolution to carry on and execute the work by day labour.
- In the absence of a resolution by Council that the work be carried on and executed by day labout, the Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to enter into a contract with some person or persons, firm or Corporation for the construction of the work, subject to the approval of the Council by Resolution.
- Treasurer may, subject to approval of the Council, agree with any bank or person for temporary advances of money to meet the cost of the work pending completion of such work.
- That debentures to be issued when the work is completed to pay for the cost of such work, shall bear interesteat such rate asthe Council may determine and shall be made payable within fifteen years on the instalment plan for sanitary sewers; within ten years for concrete sidewalks; and within five years for asphalt road surfaces.
- 10. That this by-law shall not become effective until approval in writing has been secured from the Ontario Municipal Board pursuant to Section 67 of The Ontario Municipal Board Act (R.S.O. 1950, Chapter 262).

#### BY-LAW NO. 1685

BEING A BY-LAW to establish policy for replacing of sidewalks as a Local Improvement under the provisions of The Local Improvement Act, R.S.O. 1950, Chapter 215.

WHEREAS the Municipal Corporation of the City of North Bay is desirous of establishing a policy for the replacing of sidewalks, the norman life of which walks has expired.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient that such policy he established.

THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:-

- 1. That replacing of sidewalks, the normal life of which has expired, be done under the provisions of the Local Improvement act, R.S.O. 1950, Chapter 215.
- 2. The Mayor and Clerk are authorized to cause a contract for the construction of the work to be made and entered into with some person or persons, firm or corporation, subject to the approval of the Municipal Council to be declared by Resolution, unless the work by day labour, in which event the work shall be carried on and executed by day labour under the supervision and according to the directions and order of the Engineer of the Corporation.
- 3. That a reduction of twenty-five percent (25%) in cost assessment be exempted for all property owners fronting or abutting on such works.
- 4. That a reduction of fifty percent (50%) in cost assessment be exempted for all property owners assessed for flankage lots.
- 5. That such twenty-five percent (25%) and fifty percent (50%) exemptions be borne by the Corporation at large and paid for out of the general rate.


