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# THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY 

BY-LAW NO. 57-89

BEING A BY-LAW TO REGULATE TRAFFIC AND PARKING
ON HIGHWAYS IN THE CITY OF NORTH BAY

WHEREAS the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 302, as amended, authorizes the Council to pass by-laws regulating or prohibiting certain traffic on highways and regulating or prohibiting parking on highways.

AND WHEREAS the Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 198, as amended, authorizes the Council to pass by-laws regulating traffic on highways.

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to regulate or prohibit certain traffic and to regulate or prohibit certain parking within the limits of the City of North Bay.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

PART I DEFINITIONS:

1. In this By-law:
(a) "Boulevard" means an area between:
(i) the outer edge of the shoulder of a roadway and the sidewalk or property line, or
(ii) where there is a curb along the roadway between the curb and the sidewalk or property line.
(b) "Bus" means a motor vehicle designed for carrying 10 or more passengers for hire and used for the transportation of persons.
(c) "City" means The Corporation of the City of North Bay.
(d) "Commercial Motor Vehicle" means a motor vehicle having permanently attached thereto a truck or delivery body and includes ambulances, hearses, casket wagons, fire apparatus, buses and tractors used for hauling purposes on the highways, and motor vehicles with permanent exterior courier service markings, the owner of which holds a current public commercial vehicle license from the Ontario Highway Transport Board.
(e) "Corner" means the point of intersection of the curbs or roadway.
(f) "Council" means the municipal council of The Corporation of the City of North Bay.
(g) "Crosswalk" means:
(i) that part of a highway at an intersection which is included within the connections of the lateral lines of the sidewalks on opposite sides of the highway measured from the curbs, or in the absence of curbs, from the edges of the roadway; or
(ii)any portion of a roadway at an intersection or elsewhere distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by signs or by lines or by other markings on the surface.
(h) "Curb" means the raised edge at the outer limits' of the travell portion of the road.
(i) "Emergency Vehicle" means vehicles of the police and fire departments, ambulances, civil defence and public utilities emergency vehicles.
(jl "Gross Neight" means the combined weight of vehicle and load. -
CkL "Heavy Vehicle" means a commercial vehicle for which the gross weight as shown on the registration permit issued under the Highway Traffic Act exceeds 3,000 kilograms.
(11 "Highway" includes a common and public highway, street, avenue, parkway, driveway, square, place, bridge, viaduct or trestle designed and intended for, or used by, the general public for the passage of vehicles, and "strset", and "road" shall have a like meaning.
(m) "Intersection" means the area embraced within the prolongation or connection of the lateral curb lines or, if none, then of the lateral boundary lines of two or more highways that join one another at an angle, whether or not one highway crosses the other.

Cnl "Laned Roadway" means a roadway which is divided into two or more marked lanes for vehicular traffic.

Col "Loading zone" means a designated portion of a highway adjacent to the curb reserved for the exclusive use of commercial motor vehicles and taxis during loading and unloading.
(p) " Median Strip" means the portion of a highway so constructed as to separate traffic travelling in one direction from traffic travelling in the opposite direction by physical barrier or an unpaved strip of ground.
(q) "Motor Vehicle" includes an automobile, motorcygle motor assisted bicycle unless otherwise indicated in this by-law and any other vehicle propelled or driven otherwise than by muscular power, but does not include the cars of electric or steam railways, or other motor vehicles running only on rails, or a motorized snow vehicle, traction engine, farm tractor, self-propelled implement of husbandry or road building machine within the meaning of this by-law.

Crl "Official Sign" means a sign approved by The Ministry of Transportation.
(s). "One-Way Street" means a street upon which vehicular traffic is limited to movement in one direction.
(t) "Overnight Parking" means parking for a period of longer than two consecutive hours on any street of the City between the hours of twelve o'clock midnight and eight o'clock in the morning.
(u) "Park" or "Parking" means the standing of a vehicle whether occupied or not, except when standing for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading.
(v) "Parking Manager" means the person appointed by the Council from time to time to be the Parking Manager.
(w) "Parking Meter" means a device which shall indicate thereon the length of time during which a vehicle may be parked, which shall have as part thereof a receptacle for reœiving and storing coins, a slot or place in which such coins may be deposited, a timing mechanism to indicate the passage of the interval of time during which the parking is permissible and which shall also display a signal when said interval of time shall have elapsed.
(x) "Parking Meter Zone" means the highways or parts of highways on which parking, where permitted on such highways or parts of highways is controlled and regulated by the use of parking meters.
(y) "Pedestrian" means a person afoot or in a wheelchair or a child in a carriage.
(z) "Police Constable" means a sworn member of the Police Force of the City of North Bay.
(aa) "Roadway" means the part of the highway that is improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic, but does not include the shoulder, the boulevard or the sidewalk, and, where a highway includes two or more separate roadways, the term "roadway" refers to any one roadway separately and not to all of the roadways collectively.
(bb) "Sidewalk" means that portion of a street between the curb lines or the lateral lines of a roadway and the adjacent property lines intended for the use of pedestrians.
(cc) "Sign, Authorized" means any sign or other device placed or erected on a highway under the purpose of regulating, warning, guiding or prohibiting traffic.
(dd) "Stand" or "Standing" means the halting of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except for the purpose of and while actually engaged in receiving or discharging passengers.
(ee) "Stop" or "Stopping" means the complete cessation of movement of a vehicle, even momentarily, whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a constable or other police officer or of a traffic control sign or signal.
(ff) "Traffic" includes pedestrians, ridden or herded animals, vehicles, and other conveyances either singly or together while using any street for the purpose of travel.
(gg) "Traffic Control Signal" means any device manually, electrically or mechanically operated for the regulation of traffic and placed or erected by the authority of the Council.
(hh) "U-Turn" means the turning of a vehicle within a roadway so as to proceed in the opposite direction.
(ii) "Vehicle" includes a motor vehicle, trailer, traction engine, farm tractor, road building machine and any vehicle drawn, propelled or driven by any kind of power, including muscular power, but does not include a motorized snow vehicle or the cars of electric or steam railways running only upon rails.

PART II PEDESTRIANS
2. Pedestrians shall not obstruct sidewalks or street corners so as to prevent the passage of pedestrians.

## TRAFFIC CONTROI

> 3. (1) No person shall stand, sit or ride on or in any portion of a vehicle not designed for carrying of passengers or merchandise, and no vehicle shall be operated while any person is so standing, sitting or riding.

| 4. (1) | No person shall intersect a funeral, parade or other procession authorized by the Chief of Police while it is in motion except under the direction of a Police Constable. |

## PARKING REGULATIONS

6. (1) Where a parking space is designated on a highway, no person shall park a vehicle on the highway other than within the confines of the parking space.

No person shall park a vehicle on any street, other than a one-way street, or a street where angle parking is permitted, unless:
(a) on the right hand side of the street having regard for the direction which the vehicle has been proceeding with the right front and right rear wheels not more than 15 centimeters from the curb or edge of the roadway;
(b) where no parking space is designated, the right front and rear wheels of the vehicle are parallel to and distant respectively not more than 15 centimetres from the edge of the roadway;
(c) on uncurbed roads or in the winter, vehicles are parked parallel to and as close as circumstances and weather conditions permit to the edge of the boulevard or sidewalk, as the case may be.
(3) Unless otherwise prohibited, parking of vehicles is hereby authorized on the right hand or left hand side of a one-way street, and the vehicle shall be parked facing only in the direction in which it has been proceeding and, where no parking space is designed, a vehicle shall be parked in.such a manner that the front and rear wheels nearest the curb shall be parallel to and distant not more than 15 centimetres from the curb of the roadway.
(i) Where angle parking is permitted, no person shall park a vehicle except at the angle indicated by the authorized signs and so that the front end of the vehicle is nearest the edge of the street.
(ii) Where parking spaces are designated no person shall stop or park any vehicle except within the parking space.

## NO PARKING AREAS

7. No person shall, at any time, park a vehicle in any of the following places:

Boule- (1) upon any boulevard unless approved by authorized sign;

(2) within 3 metres of a fire hydrant;
(3) within 90 metres of the scene of a fire in progress;

Priority (4) in such a position as will prevent the removal of any other vehicle previously parked;

Sidewalk (5) on any sidewalk;
Bridge (6) on any bridge or within any subway or within 15 metres of the entrance or exit thereof;

Fire Hall (7) in front of any fire hall or on the opposite side of the street for the full width of the said fire hall and an additional distance of 7.5 metres each way from said fire hall;

Hospital (8) for a distance of 9 metres in front of any entrance to a hospital;

## FUNERAL HOME PARKING

8. When authorized signs are on display, no person except persons visiting the funeral homes for compassionate reasons shall stop, stand or park a vehicle in those areas hereinafter specified at any time daily:
(a) on the east side of Cassells Street for a distance of 30 metres south of First Avenue;
(b) on the west side of Wyld Street for a distance of 30 metres south of Worthington Street.

NO PARKING AREAS - INTERSECTIONS, PARKS, NARROW STREETS
9. (1) Where official signs are on display, no person shall park, stand or stop a vehicle on a highway
(a) within 30 metres of any corner;
(b) for a distance of 3 metres on either side of a driveway to a parking lot;
(c) on that part of any street on which a public park or playground abuts;
(d) on other than one side of any street or highways, the roadway of which is less than 7.5 metres in width.
(2) The extent of No Parking areas designated by official signs or authorized signs terminate:
(a) at an intersection with a highway, or
(b) at another official sign or authorized sign designating a no parking area but not elsewhere.
10. Where authorized signs are on display, angle parking according to Section $6(4)$ is permitted on the highway at the sides and between the limits as set out in Schedule 1 of this by-law.

NO PARKING AREAS AT ANY TIME - SCHEDULE 2
11. (1) Where authorized signs are on display, no person shall park a vehicle on any road at the side of and between the limits of the road as set out in Schedule 2 of this by-law.
(2) This section does not apply on Sundays to a person parking a vehicle for the purpose of attending regular church services where a qualified member of the clergy is in attendance.

NO STOPPING AREAS - SCHEDULE 3
12. Where official signs are on display, no person shall stop a
vehicle on any roadway at the side and between the limits and
during the times or days set out in Schedule 3 of this By-law.

NO PARKING AREAS - RESTRICTED TIMES - SCHEDULES 4 and 5
13. (1) Where authorized signs are on display, no person shall park a vehicle on any road at the side of and between the limits of the road, as set out in Schedule 4 of this by-law for a longer period of time than is set out in Schedule 4 .
(2) Where authorized signs are on display, no person shall park a vehicle on any road at the side of and between the limits of the road as set out in schedule 5 of this by-law during the period of time than is set out in Schedule 5 .
(3) Where authorized signs are on display, no person shall park a vehicle on that portion of any street or streets upon which a school property abuts, between the hours of 8 o'clock in the forenoon and 5 o'clock in the afternoon except on Saturdays, Sundays and school holidays.

## NO LEFT TURNS - SCHEDULE 6

14. When official signs are on display, no person operating a vehicle at any intersection or portion of road set out in Schedule 6 of this by-law shall make a left turn during the times or days as set out in Schedule 6 .

NO U-TURNS - SCHEDULE 7
15. (1) Where U-turns are not otherwise prohibited, a U-turn shall be made only where it can be made in safety and without interfering with other traffic.
(2) No person operating a motor vehicle shall make a U-turn at an intersection provided with a traffic control signal.
(3) Where official signs are on display, no person operating a motor vehicle shall make a U-turn at the locations set out in Schedule 7 of this by-law.

## THROUGH HIGHWAYS - SCHEDULE 8

16. (1) The Highways designated on Schedule 8 of this by-law are hereby designated as through highways for the purposes of the Highway Traffic Act of Ontario, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 198, Section (1) 37, and every such highway shall be marked by a stop sign.
(2) The designation of through highways by sub-section 1 shall not include any intersection where traffic control signals have been installed nor include any intersection where the road intersected is a King's Highway.

## STOP SIGNS - SCHEDULE 9

17. The intersections set out on Schedule 9 of this by-law are
hereby designated as intersections where stop signs shall be
erected facing the direction of oncoming traffic at the
highways shown on Schedule 9.

## YIELD SIGNS - SCHEDULE 10

18. The intersections set out on Schedule 10 of this by-law are designated as intersections where Yield Right of Way Signs shall be erected facing the direction of oncoming traffic at the highways shown on Schedule 10.

## TRUCK ROUTES - SCHEDULE 11

19. (1) The highways or parts of highways described on Schedule 11 of this by-law are hereby designated as "truck routes".
(2) Where authorized signs are on display, no person shall operate or park a heavy vehicle on any highway in the City other than on the highways designated as truck routes on Schedule 11 of this by-law.
(3) Notwithstanding sub-section 2, a heavy vehicle may be driven to make a direct delivery to or collection from a bona fide destination in the City, provided that the operator of the heavy vehicle proceeds by the most direct route between the nearest truck route and the place of delivery or pick-up in the City and on completion of the conduct of business, the heavy vehicle is returned by the most direct route to the nearest truck route.

## ONE-WAY STREETS - SCHEDULE 12

20. (1) The streets or parts of streets set out in Column 1 of Schedule 12 of this by-law between the limits set out in Column 2 of Schedule 12 are hereby designated for one-way traffic only in the direction set out in Column 3 of Schedule 12 of this by-law.
(2) No person shall drive a vehicle on any portion of any street described in Schedule 12 other than in the direction set out in Schedule 12 .
21. (1) No person shall drive a vehicle at a greater rate of speed on
any highway set out in Schedule 13 of this by-law than the rate
of speed set out in Schedule l3.
(2) No provision of this section becomes effective until the highways
or portions thereof affected by Schedule 13 are marked to show
the authorized rate of speed by the city.
22. (1) The Director of Engineering and Works is hereby authorized to designate by authorized signs, bus stops within thirty metres of an intersection.
(2) When authorized signs are on display, no person shall stand or park a vehicle, other than a bus on a portion of the highway designated as a bus stop.

SCHOOL BUS LOADING ZONES - SCHEDULE 14
23. (1) School bus loading zones are hereby established on those
portions of the highways set out in Schedule 14 of this by-law.
(2) No person shall park or stand a vehicle other than a school bus
in a school bus loading zone.

LOADING ZONES - SCHEDULE 15
24. (1) In this section "Commercial Motor Vehicles" means a motor vehicle which is identified by a sign painted on or firmly attached to the outside of the vehicle, which bears the name or style of the business and which vehicle is used for the purpose of delivery of materials.
(2) Loading zones are hereby established on those portions of the highway set out in Scheđule 15 of this by-law.
(3) No person shall park or stand a vehicle other than a commercial motor vehicle or taxi in a loading zone.
(4) No person shall park a commercial motor vehicle in a loading zone except while actively engaged in loading or unloading materials.
(5) No person shall park a commercial motor vehicle in a loading zone for more than twenty (20) minutes.
(6) No driver of a vehicle shall stand a vehicle perpendicular to the curb except:
(a) when loading or unloading materials, and
(b) the vehicle is a semi-trailer or trailer combination whereby the motor vehicle or truck tractor unit thereof stands parallel to the curb and faced in the direction of going traffic, and
(c) the vehicle does not interfere with or interrupt the passage of traffic.
(7) No person shall transfer merchandise or materials of any kind from a commercial motor vehicle to another vehicle on any street except in the event of mechanical failure or breakdown.
25. When authorized signs are on display, no person shall drive or move a vehicle or combination of vehicles over any bridge described in Schedule 16 of this by-law where the gross weight of the vehicle exceeds the gross weight limits listed on Schedule 16.

## TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNALS - SCHEDULE 17

26. (1) The installation and operation of traffic control signals at the locations designated on Schedule 17 of this by-law is hereby authorized.
(2) The Director of Engineering and Works is hereby authorized to place and maintain all traffic control signals designated in Schedule 17.

## PART III-PARKING METER ZONES - SCHEDULE 18 - WHERE PARKING IS NOT OTHERWISE PROHIBITED

27. (1) Parking meter zones are hereby established upon those highways or portion of highways described on Schedule 18 of this by-law.
(2) Parking of vehicles upon the highways within the parking meter zones shall be regulated by parking meters on any day except Sunday and public holidays, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

(a) No vehicle shall be parked at any parking meter zone during the applicable days and hours described in Schedule 18 to this by-law:
(i) unless and until there is deposited in the appropriate parking meter a fee of one (1) five cent (5 ) coin, one (1) ten cent (10 $)$ coin or one (1) twenty-five (25\%) coin for the period of authorized parking described in Schedule 18;
(ii) the parking meter is activated; and
(iii) in no case longer than the maximum authorized parking time at that parking meter as stipulated in Schedule 18.
(b) Every vehicle parked in a parking meter zone described in Schedule 18 to this by-law shall make use of the parking meter immediately adjacent to the parking space within which such vehicle is parked and the fee set by Schedule 18 of this by-law shall be paid by the driver of the vehicle.
(c) (i) Parallel Parking - The front bumper of any vehicle shall be adjacent to any single parking meter, or the front or rear bumper, as indicated on the appropriate parking meter, shall be adjacent to any double parking meter.
(ii) Angle Parking - The front bumper of any vehicle parked shall be adjacent to the appropriate parking meter.

No person shall park a vehicle in any designated parking meter space so that any part of the vehicle occupies more than one space, or protrudes beyond the markings designating such space; except that a vehicle which is of a size too large to be parked within a single designated parking meter space shall be permitted to occupy two adjoining parking meter spaces when coins shall have been deposited in the parking meter for each space so occupied as is reguired in this by-law for the parking of other vehicles in such spaces.

No person shall park a vehicle in any such parking meter space for a consecutive period of time longer than that perio of time for which parking is lawfully permitted in the parking meter zone in which such parking meter is located, irrespective of the number or amounts of the coins deposited in such meter.

No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited in any parking meter any slug, device or other substitute for a coin, or affix to the parking meter any material which could interfere with the normal operation of the meter or mechanism thereof.

Each parking meter shall bear thereon a legend indicating the days and hours when the requirement to deposit a coin or coins therein shall apply, the value of the coins to be deposited and the legal parking time therefor and the limited period of time for which parking is lawfully permitted in the parking meter zone in which such meter is located.

Where a motor vehicle is parked in a parking space when a time signal in a parking meter adjacent to the same shows a violation or that no parking is permitted unless a deposit of a proper coin is made as herein provided, it shall be prima facie evidence of the unlawful parking of such motor vehicle by its owner or operator.

The Director of Engineering and Works shall designate individual spaces pursuant to section 27 (1) along the highways in the parking meter zones designated in Schedule 18 and shall erect and maintain parking meters as set out in sub-section 2 of this section.

Parking meters with the necessary standards for the same shall be erected, maintained and operated in the parking meter zones for the purpose of controlling and regulating the parking of any vehicle in such a zone and measuring and recording the duration of such parking. Each parking meter shall be so designated, and set that upon the expiration of the time period registered by the deposit of one or more coins as provided herein, it will indicate by an appropriate signal that the lawful parking meter period has expired and prior to the expiration thereof, will indicate the interval of time which remains of such period.
(a) A person in authority at a church or funeral home within a "No Parking" Zone or a parking meter zone at which weddings or funeral services are being held in hereby authorized to place signs on parking meters to indicate that parking, except for those attending such service is temporarily prohibited in the parking spaces so marked, for a period of one hour in advance of the scheduled time of such service and during such service.
(b) Where "No Parking"Signs of the type authorized by section 31(1) (a) are displayed, no person shall park a vehicle at any of the parking meters concerned or along the curb space concerned, as the case may be, unless permitted to do so by a person in authority at the church or funeral home.
(a) The Director of Engineering and Works may, by use of appropriate signs or signals, suspend the movement of any or all vehicular traffic on any street or portion thereof in the parking meter zone or may suspend any or all parking thereon by authorizing the affixing of "no parking signs" to each parking meter, where highway construction, repair, painting or any emergency occurs.
(b) The Chief of Police or a Deputy Chief of Police during any emergency may declare that any vehicle already parked is parked illegally regardless of the time permitted for parking such vehicle under the provisions of this section; and notwithstanding that the period allowed to the owner

or driver under this section has not expired, provided, however, that in this event the owner or driver of such vehicle shall be personally notified by a police officer that parking at such place has been suspended, and, further, that the owner or driver of such vehicle is allowed a reasonable period of time to remove said vehicle.
(c) Subject to subsection (d) on request by persons requiring a parking space for a period longer than the time limit indicated on a parking meter, the Parking Manager may issue and install parking meter hoods to cover parking meters.
(d) The sum of three dollars $(\$ 3.00)$ per day shall be paid in advance to the City of North Bay for each parking meter hood issued pursuant to subsection (c).
(e) Subsection (d) shall not apply to parking meter hoods issued for churches, funerals, weddings, elderly or physically handicapped groups or other non-profit groups.

The collection of coins deposited in parking meters be under the control of the Parking Manager who shall keep a proper record of same and deposit same to the credit of the city.

In this section,
(a) "Disabled Person" means a person who is physically disabled in such a way that his or her mobility is severely restricted including persons who use a wheelchair, crutches, braces and other mobility assisting devices.
(b) "Identifying Marker" means a marker consisting of the international symbol for the disabled to be used to identify an authorized vehicle;
(c) "Permit" means a permit issued to a disabled person by the Parking Manager or any license plate issued under the Highway. Traffic Act for a disabled person.
(2) The Parking Manager is hereby authorized to issue permits to disabled persons in respect of vehicles that are issued by disabled persons and to issue identifying markers in connection with the permit.
(a) Where an identifying marker issued in connection with the permit is properly displayed, the owner and driver of such vehicle are exempt from section 27 respecting parking meters.
(b) Where authorized signs are on display, no vehicle shall be parked without an identifying marker issued in connection with a permit, properly displayed, on the highway or parts thereof set out on Schedule 20 hereto.
(4) (a) The identifying marker issued in connection with a permit shall be affixed to the sun visor of the passenger's side of the motor vehicle so that it is readily visible from outside the vehicle when the visor is turned down.
(b) An identifying marker issued in connection with a permit shall be deemed to be properly displayed when the visor is turned down and the identifying marker is readily visible from outside the vehicle.
(5) (a) No person other than a disabled person shall acquire or use a permit in respect of a motor vehicle.
(b) No person other than a person who has acquired a permit shall acquire or use an identifying marker issued in connection with the permit.
(c) No person shall use other than in the manner provided for in this by-law an identifying marker issued in connection with a permit.
33. (1) The Director of Engineering \& Works or the Corporation is hereby authorized to place or erect, and to maintain such official signs and signs and traffic control devices as may be necessary to give effect to the provisions of this by-law or as are required to warn or guide traffic for the safety or convenience of the public.
(2) The Director of Engineering \& Works is hereby authorized to place and maintain temporary traffic signs for the purpose of regulating or prohibiting traffic where highway construction, repair, painting or other emergency occurs.
(3) The Director of Engineering \& Works is hereby authorized to remove or cause to be removed without notice any sign, signal, marking device found on a highway which resembles an official sign or authorized sign but which is not an official sign or authorized sign.

## INTERPRETATION

34. (1) The provisions of this by-law shall be subject to the provisions of the Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 198, as amended, and to any regulations made thereunder and any reference in this by-law to the said Highway Traffic Act or any provision thereof shall be deemed to be a reference to the said Highway Traffic Act or provisions thereof as amended or re-enacted from time to time.
(2) The provisions of this by-law dealing with restrictions of standing, parking or time limits on parking shall not relieve any person from the duty of observing other more restrictive provisions, prohibiting or limiting the stopping, standing or parking of vehicles in specified places cr at specified times.
(3) The provisions of this by-law prohibiting parking or standing shall not apply to:
(a) vehicles of the Police and Fire Departments of the City of North Bay,
(b) vehicles of or employed by the City of North Bay in use in connection with public works being done on or near a street,
(c) vehicles of Her Majesty's mail,
(d) a vehicle, the crew of which is engaged in making emergency repairs to a public utility or service.
(4) Whenever this by-law refers to the time of day or hour, the same shall be construed in accordance with standard time or daylight saving time as may be in current use in the City of North Bay.
(5) The MANUAL OF UNIFORM TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES OF THE MINISTRY OF TRANSPORTATION OF ONTARIO is hereby adopted as it applies to the provisions of this by-law.
(6) All sections and subsections of this by-law shall be deemed to be separate and independent and the invalidity of any Section or provision thereof shall not affect the remaining Section or by-law.
(7) The provisions of this by-law apply only to highways in the City which are under the jurisdiction of the City.
(8) Schedules (1) to (19) inclusive which are attached hereto are hereby made a part of this by-law and shall be construed herewith.

## PENALTIES

35. (1) Any person who contravenes any provision of this by-law except Sections 6 to 13 inclusive, 16,21 , $22,23,24$ and 27 , is guilty of an offence and is liable to a penalty of not less than $\$ 10.00$ and not more than $\$ 300.00$, exclusive of costs, and such penalty shall be recovered under the Summary Convictions Act or the Provincial Offences Act whichever is applicable.
(2) Any person who contravenes any provision of Sections 6 to 13 inclusive, 22,23 and 24 , is guilty of an offence and is liable to a penalty of not less than $\$ 10.00$ and not more than $\$ 50.00$, exclusive of costs and such penalty shall be recovered under the Summary Convictions Act or the Provincial Offences Act whichever is applicable.
(3) Any person who contravenes any provision of Sections 16 or 21 is guilty of an offence and is liable to a penalty of not less than $\$ 25.00$ and not more than $\$ 300.00$ exclusive of costs and such penalty shall be levied pursuant to the Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 202, as amended, and recovered under the Summary Convictions Act or the Provincial Offences Act, whichever is applicable.
(4) Any person who contravenes any provision of section 27 is guilty of an offence and is liable to a penalty of not less than $\$ 3.00$ and not more than $\$ 50.00$, exclusive of costs, and such penalty shall be recovered under the Summary Convictions Act or the Provincial Offences Act, whichever is applicable.
(5) (a) When a vehicle is found parked or stopped in contravention of the parking or stopping provisions of this by-law, the police officer or officer or agent of the City so finding the vehicle may issue a summons or offence notice or attach to the vehicle a parking ticket in the form of a seriallynumbered notice, stating:
(1) the license number or permit of the vehicle;
(2) the date, time, place and nature of the alleged offence;
(3) the procedure for making a voluntary payment of the penalty, which voluntary payment shall not be less than the prescribed amount set out in Section 35 of Part VI of this By-law;
(4) that in the event of the event of the failure to make payment of $\$ 3.00$ for an offence under sub-section (4) hereof within 96 hours (or $\$ 5.00$ within three (3) weeks) exclusive of costs, process will be issued pursuant to the Summary Convictions Act, or under the Provincial Offences Act, whichever is applicable;
(5) that in the event of the failure to make payment of $\$ 10.00$ for an offence under sub-section (2) hereof within 96 hours, exclusive of costs, process will be issued pursuant to the Summary Convictions Act, or under the Provincial Offences Act, whichever is applicable.
(b) The owner or operator of the vehicle may, within five days, exclusive of Sundays and holidays, after the day of the alleged offence, report to or mail to the Parking Manager, 200 McIntyre Street. East, P. O. Box 360, North Bay, Ontario, P1B 8H8, and pay to those persons authorized to receive such payment, the amount shown on the ticket which shall be accepted as payment of the penalty in full satisfaction in respect of the alleged offence, and a receipt therefor shall be given to the person making the payment.
(c) The Parking Manager or the City Treasurer shall receive all monies collected under this section and pay or authorize the deduction of a service fee to persons or institutions for penalties collected by those persons or institutions.
(d) If a voluntary payment is not made in accordance with the procedure in sub-section (2) of this section, the procedure of the Summary Convictions Act, or the Provincial Offences Act, whichever is applicable shall apply.
(6) The owner of a vehicle that is parked or stopped or standing in contravention of the provisions of this by-law is guilty of an offence and on conviction is liable to a fine of not less than $\$ 3.00$ and not more than $\$ 300.00$ exclusive of costs, unless that owner proves to the satisfaction of the Court that at the time of the offence the motor vehicle was in the possession of another person without the owner's consent, express or implied.

Repetition of Offence
36.

Where any person contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law and a conviction is entered therefor, the City may, in addition to any other remedy and to any penalty imposed by this By-law, request an Order prohibiting the continuation or repetition of the offence by the person convicted.

## REPEAL OF PREVIOUS BY-LAWS:

37. Where any vehicle is found to be parked in contravention of this by-law and such vehicle is is interfering with the movement of traffic or with snow removal operations, then such vehicle may be towed away, at the direction of a police officer, at the sole risk and expense of the owner.
38. (1) By-law No. 2-82 and any amendments thereto are hereby repealed.
(2) In addition, any or all by-laws in conflict or at variance herewith are hereby repealed and this by-law shall take precedence.
39. (1) This by-law shall not come into force until finally passed by the Council and approved in accordance with the Highway Traffic Act, R.S.o. 1980, c. 198, as amended.
(2) No provision of this by-law shall become effective until the sign or signs, if any, applicable to such particular provisions have been erected and are on display.
(3) Subject to subsections (1) and (2) above, this by-law shall come into force and take effect on final passing thereof.
